**Our Lady on Saturday or**

**St Callistus I, Pope and Martyr**

*Callistus died in 222. He was born a slave. As Pope he treated apostates gently. He organised the first Christian cemetery in Rome and died a martyr's death.*

Entrance Antiphon: **Within your will, O Lord, all things are established, and there is none that can resist your will. For you have made all things, the heaven and the earth, and all that is held within the circle of heaven; you are the Lord of all.**

BVM Antiphon(7): **Mary said: My spirit rejoices in God my Saviour, because the Lord has looked on his lowly handmaid.**

First Reading: Joel 4:12-21

*Put the sickle in; the harvest is ripe.*

Responsorial Psalm: **Rejoice, you just, in the Lord.**

Gospel Acclamation: **Alleluia, alleluia! If anyone loves me he will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we shall come to him. Alleluia!**

Gospel: Luke 11:27-28

*Happy the womb that bore you! Still happier those who hear the word of God.*

Communion Antiphon: **The Lord is good to those who hope in him, to those who are searching for his love.**

BVM Antiphon(7): **Mary treasured all these words, reflecting on them in her heart.**

**Monday, 9<sup>th</sup> October**

**BLESSED JOHN HENRY NEWMAN, PRIEST**

*Born in London in 1801, John Henry Newman became an Anglican Priest and leader of the Oxford Movement. Through study of the early Church he was drawn to the Catholic Church and received into full communion by Blessed Dominic Barberi at Littlemore in Oxfordshire on this day in 1847. Encouraged by Blessed Pope Pius IX, Newman founded the Oratory of St Philip Neri in England and was later made a Cardinal of the Church. He died in 1890 at the Birmingham Oratory.*

Entrance Antiphon: **Your priests, O Lord, shall be clothed with justice; your holy ones shall ring out their joy.**

The **Gloria** is said.

First Reading: *Jeremiah 1:4-9*

*Go now to those whom I send you.*

Responsorial Psalm: **Proclaim the wonders of the Lord among all the peoples.**

Gospel Acclamation: **Alleluia, alleluia! I am the vine, you are the branches, says the Lord: Whoever remains in me, with me in him, bears fruit in plenty. Alleluia!**

Gospel: John 15:9-17

*I shall not call you servants anymore, I call you friends.*

Communion Antiphon: **Blessed is the servant whom the Lord finds watching when he comes. Amen I say to you: He will put that servant in charge of all his property.**

**Tuesday, 10<sup>th</sup> October**

**Weekday or St Paulinus of York, Bishop**

*Paulinus was not part of Augustine's voyage of 597 but was sent a little later in 601 to help with the abundance of converts and was appointed Bishop of Rochester, where he died in 644.*

Entrance Antiphon: **Within your will, O Lord, all things are established, and there is none that can resist your will. For you have made all things, the heaven and the earth, and all that is held within the circle of heaven; you are the Lord of all.**

First Reading: Jonah 3:1-10  
*The people of Nineveh renounced their evil behaviour, and God relented.*

Responsorial Psalm: **If you, O Lord, should mark our guilt, Lord, who would survive?**

Gospel Acclamation: **Alleluia, alleluia! I call you friends, says the Lord, because I have made known to you everything I have learnt from my Father. Alleluia!**

Gospel: Luke 10:38-42  
*Martha welcomed Jesus into her house. It was Mary who has chosen the better part.*

Communion Antiphon: **The Lord is good to those who hope in him, to those who are searching for his love.**

**Wednesday, 11<sup>th</sup> October**

**Weekday or  
Blessed William Howard, Martyr**

*William was born in 1612 and married Mary, daughter of Lord Stafford. They were the devoted parents to nine children. Forced to live much of their lives abroad but he was falsely accused in 1678 of being part of the 'Popish Plot'. he was beheaded in 1680.*

Entrance Antiphon: **Within your will, O Lord, all things are established, and there is none that can resist your will. For you have made all things, the heaven and the earth, and all that is held within the circle of heaven; you are the Lord of all.**

Bl William Antiphon: **Here is a true martyr who shed his blood for Christ; his judges could not shake him by their menaces, and so he won through to the Kingdom of Heaven.**

First Reading: Jonah 4:1-11  
*You are only upset about a castor-plant. Am I not to feel sorry for Nineveh, the great city!*

Responsorial Psalm: **You, O Lord, have mercy and compassion.**

Gospel Acclamation: **Alleluia, alleluia! Train me, Lord, to observe your law, to keep it with my heart. Alleluia!**

Gospel: Luke 11:1-4  
*Lord, teach us to pray.*

Communion Antiphon: **The Lord is good to those who hope in him, to the soul that seeks him.**

Bl William Antiphon: **The crown of the aged is their children's children; the children's glory is their father.**

**Thursday, 12<sup>th</sup> October**

**Weekday or  
St Wilfrid, Bishop**

*Wilfrid is one of the saints from Lindisfarne who became bishop of York. At the Synod of Whitby he championed Roman customs, including dating Easter*

Entrance Antiphon: **Within your will, O Lord, all things are established, and there is none that can resist your will. For you have made all things, the heaven and the earth, and all that is held within the circle of heaven; you are the Lord of all.**

First Reading: Malachi 3:13-20  
*The day is coming now, burning life a furnace.*

Responsorial Psalm: **Happy the man who has placed his trust in the Lord.**

Gospel Acclamation: **Alleluia, alleluia! I am the Way, the Truth and the Life, says the Lord; no one can come to the Father except through me. Alleluia!**

Gospel: Luke 11:5-13  
*Ask, and it will be given to you.*

Communion Antiphon: **The Lord is good to those who hope in him, to those who are searching for his love.**

**Friday, 13<sup>th</sup> October**

**Weekday or  
St Edward the Confessor, King**

*Edward died in 1066. King of England, he was accessible to his subjects and generous to the poor. He founded Westminster Abbey, placing it under the patronage of St Peter, the then Patron of England. Edward's relics still remain there in a medieval shrine.*

Entrance Antiphon: **Within your will, O Lord, all things are established, and there is none that can resist your will. For you have made all things, the heaven and the earth, and all that is held within the circle of heaven; you are the Lord of all.**
