The **Gloria** is said.

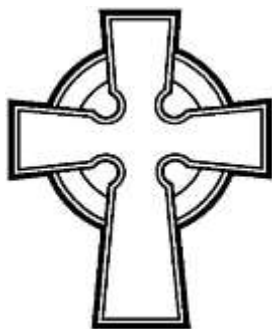
First Reading: Ephesians 2:19-22

Gospel: Luke 6:12-19  
*Jesus picked out twelve of his disciples and called them 'apostles'.*

Communion Antiphon: **Whoever loves me will keep my word, says the Lord; and my Father will love him, and we will come to him, and make our home with him.**

Monday, 23<sup>rd</sup> October

Weekday or  
St John of Capistrano, Priest

*John was a successful preacher, committed Franciscan reformer, zealous inquisitor in Vienna, and spiritual leader of a victorious crusade against the Ottoman forces. he died on this day in 1456.*

Entrance Antiphon: **To you I call; for you will surely heed me, O God; turn your ear to me; hear my words. Guard me as the apple of your eye; in the shadow of your wings protect me.**

First Reading: Romans 4:20-25  
*Scripture says that our faith too will be 'considered' if we believe in him.*

Responsorial Psalm: **Blessed be the Lord, the God of Israel! He has visited his people.**

Gospel Acclamation: **Alleluia, alleluia! Teach me your paths, my God, make me walk in your truth. Alleluia!**

Gospel: Luke 12:13-21  
*This hoard of yours, whose will it be?*

Communion Antiphon: **Behold, the eyes of the Lord are on those who fear him, who hope in his merciful love, to rescue their souls from death, to keep them alive in famine.**

Tuesday, 24<sup>th</sup> October

Weekday or St Anthony Mary Claret, Bishop

*Anthony died in 1870. He was a Spanish Jesuit of great culture and learning. He founded the Claretians, Missionary Sons of the Immaculate Heart of Mary. He was appointed Archbishop of Cuba and was credited as a good pastor. He had to endure great hostility.*

Entrance Antiphon: **To you I call; for you will surely heed me, O God; turn your ear to me; hear my words. Guard me as the apple of your eye; in the shadow of your wings protect me.**

First Reading: Romans 5:12. 15. 17-21

*If death reigned over everyone as the consequences of one man's fall, it is even more certain that everyone will reign in life.*

Responsorial Psalm: **Here I am, Lord! I come to do your will.**

Gospel Acclamation: **Alleluia, alleluia! Blessed are those who, with a noble and generous heart, take the word of God to themselves and yield a harvest through their perseverance. Alleluia!**

Gospel: Luke 12:35-38

*Happy those servants whom the master finds awake when he comes.*

Communion Antiphon: **Behold, the eyes of the Lord are on those who fear him, who hope in his merciful love, to rescue their souls from death, to keep them alive in famine.**

## Wednesday, 25th October

### Weekday

Entrance Antiphon: **To you I call; for you will surely heed me, O God; turn your ear to me; hear my words. Guard me as the apple of your eye; in the shadow of your wings protect me.**

First Reading: Romans 6:12-18

*Offer yourselves to God, and consider yourselves dead men brought back to life.*

Responsorial Psalm: **Our help is in the name of the Lord.**

Gospel Acclamation: **Alleluia, alleluia! The sheep that belong to me listen to my voice, says the Lord, I know them and they follow me. Alleluia!**

Gospel: Luke 12:39-48

*When a man has had a great deal given him, a great deal will be demanded of him.*

## Thursday, 26th October

### Weekday or St Cedd, Bishop

*Cedd died in 664. A brother of Chad, he was sent to the East Saxons.*

Entrance Antiphon: **To you I call; for you will surely heed me, O God; turn your ear to me; hear my words. Guard me as the apple of your eye; in the shadow of your wings protect me.**

First Reading: Romans 6:19-23

*Now you have been set free from sin, you have been made slaves of God.*

Responsorial Psalm: **Happy the man who has placed his trust in the Lord.**

Gospel Acclamation: **Alleluia, alleluia! I am the light of the world, says the Lord, anyone who follows me will have the light of life. Alleluia!**

Gospel: Luke 12:49-53

*I am here not to bring peace but division.*

Communion Antiphon: **Behold, the eyes of the Lord are on those who fear him, who hope in his merciful love, to rescue their souls from death, to keep them alive in famine.**

## Friday, 27th October

### Weekday
