St Martin of Tours, Bishop

Martin died in 397. He was a convert and a disciple of St Hilary. At Liguge he founded the first monastery in the West. He became bishop of Tours and was the first non-martyr to be assigned a feast in the Church's calendar.

First Reading: Romans 16: 3-9 16. 22-27

Greet each other with a holy kiss.

Responsorial Psalm: **I will bless your name forever, O Lord.**

Gospel: Luke 16: 9-15

If you cannot be trusted with money, that tainted thing, who will trust you with genuine riches?

Monday, 6th November

Entrance Antiphon: **Forsake me not, O Lord, my God; be not far from me! Make haste and come to my help, O Lord, my strong salvation!**

St Willibrord, Bishop

Willibrord died in 739. His life exemplifies the virtues of patience and resignation to the will of God. It was his unhappy fate to see much of his life's work swept away after years of missionary labour, yet he never became daunted. He continued to work tirelessly in his task of preaching the Gospel, and trusted in the providence of God to make all things well in the end.

First Reading: Romans 12:5-16

We belong to each other as parts.

Responsorial Psalm: **Keep my soul in peace before you, O Lord.**

Bl. George Napier, Priest and Martyr

George died in 1610. He was born in Oxford and educated at Douai. For seven years he carried out his priestly work in England before being martyred.

Bl. George Antiphon: **The Holy Martyrs shed their blood on earth for Christ; therefore they have received an everlasting reward.**

THE DEDICATION OF THE LATERAN BASILICA

The basilica of John Lateran is the Cathedral Church of Rome. It was built by the Emperor Constantine and is the 'Mother Church' of the city and the world.

Entrance Antiphon: **I saw the holy city, a new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, prepared like a bride adorned for her husband.**

Gloria is said.

First Reading: Ezekiel 47:1-2, 8-9, 12

I saw a stream of water coming from the Temple, bringing life to all wherever it flowed.

Responsorial Psalm: **The waters of a river give joy to God's city, the holy place where the Most High dwells.**

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 3:9-11, 16-17

You are the temple of God.

Gospel Acclamation: **Alleluia, alleluia! I have chosen and consecrated this house, says the Lord, for my name to be there for ever. Alleluia!**

Gospel: John 2:13-22

He was speaking of the sanctuary that was his body.

Communion Antiphon: **Be built up like living stones, into a spiritual house, a holy priesthood.**

Friday, 10th November

**St Leo the Great,
Pope & Doctor of the Church**

Leo died in 461. He was an eminent pastor and preacher. Twice he saved Rome from Barbarian invasion and his formulation of Christ's two natures was adopted by the Council of Chalcedon.
