

Saturday, 18th November

The Dedication of the Basilicas of Saints Peter and Paul, Apostles or

Votive Mass of Our Blessed lady

This feast was inscribed in the Roman Calendar by Pope Pius V in 1568 although it had been celebrated since the 11th century.

Dedication Antiphon: You will make them princes over all the earth; they will remember your name through all generations. Thus the peoples will praise you forever, from age to age.

BVM Antiphon (5): Hail, Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with you. Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb.

First Reading: Wisdom 18:14-16; 19:6-9
The Red Sea became an unimpeded way, and they skipped like lambs.

Responsorial Psalm: Remember the wonders the Lord has done.

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia! Accept and submit to the word which has been planted in you and can save your souls. Alleluia!

Gospel: Luke 18:1-8
God will see justice done to his chosen who cry to him.

Dedication Antiphon: O Lord, you have the words of eternal life, and we have come to believe that you are the Christ, the Son of God.

BVM Antiphon (5): Glorious things are spoken of you, O Virgin Mary, for he who is mighty has done great things for you.

Monday, 13th November

Entrance Antiphon: Let my prayer come into your presence. Incline your ear to my cry for help, O Lord.

First Reading: Wisdom 1:1-7
Wisdom is a spirit, a friend to man. The Spirit of the Lord fills the whole world.

Responsorial Psalm: Lead me, O Lord, in the path of life eternal.

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia! You will shine in the world like bright stars because you are offering it the word of life. Alleluia!

Gospel: Luke 17:1-6
If your brother comes back to you seven times a day and says, 'I am sorry,' you must forgive him.

Communion Antiphon: The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want. Fresh and green are the pastures where he gives me repose, near restful waters he leads me.

Weekday
Tuesday, 14th November

Entrance Antiphon: Let my prayer come into your presence. Incline your ear to my cry for help, O Lord.

First Reading: Wisdom 2:23 - 3:9
In the eyes of the unwise, they did appear to die, but they are in peace.

Responsorial Psalm: I will bless the Lord at all times.

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia! Man does not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes from the mouth of God. Alleluia!

Gospel: Luke 17:7-10
We are merely servants: we have done no more than our duty.

Communion Antiphon: The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want. Fresh and green are the pastures where he gives me repose, near restful waters he leads me.

Wednesday, 15th November

Weekday or
**St Albert the Great, Bishop and
Doctor of the Church**

Albert died at Cologne in 1280. A Dominican who was appointed Bishop of Ratisbon. He was a prolific writer specialising in natural sciences, philosophy and theology.

Entrance Antiphon: **Let my prayer come into your presence. Incline your ear to my cry for help, O Lord.**

First Reading: Wisdom 6:1-11
Listen, kings, that you may learn what wisdom is.

Responsorial Psalm: **Arise, O God, judge the earth.**

Gospel Acclamation: **Alleluia, alleluia! Through the Good News God called us to share the glory of our Lord Jesus Christ. Alleluia!**

Gospel: Luke 17:11-19
No one has come back to give praise to God, except this foreigner.

Communion Antiphon: **The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want. Fresh and green are the pastures where he gives me repose, near restful waters he leads me.**

Thursday, 16th November

Weekday or
**St Edmund of Abingdon, Bishop or
St Margaret of Scotland or
St Gertrude, Virgin or
Our Lady on Saturday**

Edmund died in 1240. He was a reforming Bishop and peacemaker who was Archbishop of Canterbury.

Margaret died in 1093. She was married to King Malcolm III of Scotland and had eight children. She was renowned for her love and care of the poor. She is Secondary Patron of Scotland.

Gertrude died in 1301. Being entrusted to nuns at the age of five she became a mystic who fostered devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

Entrance Antiphon: **Let my prayer come into your presence. Incline your ear to my cry for help, O Lord.**

First Reading: Wisdom 7:22 – 8:1
Wisdom is a reflection of the eternal light, untarnished mirror of God's power.

Responsorial Psalm: **You word, O Lord, stands for ever.**

Gospel Acclamation: **Alleluia, alleluia! The word of the Lord remains for ever: What is this word? It is the Good News that has been brought to you. Alleluia!**

Gospel: Luke 17:20-25
The kingdom of God is among you.

Communion Antiphon: **The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want. Fresh and green are the pastures where he gives me repose, near restful waters he leads me.**

Friday, 17th November

Weekday or
**St Elizabeth of Hungary, Religious or
Saint Hilda, Religious or
St Huga of Lincoln, Bishop**

Elizabeth was married and widowed at a very young age. She died in 1231 at the age of 24 leaving three sons. She was a Franciscan tertiary who was devoted to the poor. Five years after her death she was canonised.

Hilda died in 680. She hosted the Synod of Whitby and was the Abbess of a double monastery, of both monks and nuns.

Hugh entered the Grand Chartreuse of Grenoble at the age of 25. Being sent to England to be Prior he was, however, appointed Bishop of Lincoln. He gained a reputation for justice, care of the sick, and supporting the oppressed.

Entrance Antiphon: **Let my prayer come into your presence. Incline your ear to my cry for help, O Lord.**

First Reading: Wisdom 13:1-9
If they are capable of investigating the world, how have they been so slow to find its Master?

Responsorial Psalm: **The heavens proclaim the glory of God.**

Gospel Acclamation: **Alleluia, alleluia! The word of God is something alive and active; it can judge secret emotions and thoughts. Alleluia!**

Gospel: Luke 17:26-37
When the day comes for the Son of Man to be revealed.

Communion Antiphon: **The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want. Fresh and green are the pastures where he gives me repose, near restful waters he leads me.**
