THE ASSUMPTION OF OUR LADY is celebrated this Tuesday, 15th August. We will be celebrating this great day as a community with a Solemn Vigil Mass on Monday 14th August at 7pm, followed by refreshments. Please let Susan Hutchinson know if you are able to serve. I hope we will be present in good number.

NEW ORDINARIATE CHASUBLE The priests of each diocese have a chasuble which is distinctive to that diocese and is usually worn at diocesan events e.g. ordinations. It is a visible reminder of the unity of the priests of the diocese (the presbyterate) with the bishop and with one another. Back in 2011 priests of the ordinariate were gifted the chasubles made for the Mass of Beatification of John Henry Newman in Birmingham by Pope Benedict XVI. While this was a very poignant and much-appreciated gesture, the beatification chasubles are not of great quality or beauty (what our Patron would make of polyester vestments, I don't know!), and have become less and less distinctive to the ordinariate as they have become more and more widely distributed around other dioceses. Therefore a new chasuble has been commissioned and created for the ordinariate. The orphrey (embroidered panel running from top to bottom on front and back) includes pairs of hearts representing our Patron, Blessed John Henry Newman (*Cor ad cor loquitur*, Heart speaks to heart, was Newman's motto) and lilies representing Our Lady of Walsingham. The Friends of the Ordinariate have very generously subsidised the cost of the new vestments. Look out for them being worn in the future.
