**St Hilary, Bishop and Doctor of the Church  
or Blessed Virgin Mary on Saturday**

*Hilary was born into a pagan family. Shortly after they were baptised, he was chosen as Bishop of Poitiers. He was outstanding in his teaching of the faith.*

Entrance Antiphon: **Upon a lofty throne, I saw a man seated, whom a host of angels adore, singing in unison: Behold him, the name of whose empire is eternal.**

BVM Antiphon (1): **Hail, Holy Mother, who gave birth to the King who rules heaven and earth for ever.**

First Reading: 1 Samuel 9:1-4, 17-19; 10:1  
*The Lord told Samuel, 'That is the man of whom I told you; Saul shall rule my people.'*

Responsorial Psalm: **O Lord, your strength gives joy to the king.**

Gospel Acclamation: **Alleluia, alleluia! Bend my heart to your will, O Lord, and teach me your law. Alleluia!**

Gospel: Mark 2:13-17  
*I did not come to call the virtuous, but sinners.*

Communion Antiphon: **With you, O Lord, is the fountain of life, and in your light we see light.**

BVM Antiphon (1): **Blessed is the womb of the Virgin Mary, which bore the Son of the eternal Father.**

**Monday, 8<sup>th</sup> January**

**FEAST OF THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD**

Entrance Antiphon: **After the Lord was baptised, the heavens were opened, and the Spirit descended upon him like a dove, and the voice of the Father thundered: This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased.**

The **Gloria** is said.

First Reading: Isaiah 55:1-11  
*Come to the water. Listen and your soul will live.*

Responsorial Psalm: **With joy you will draw water from the wells of salvation.**

Second Reading: 1 John 5:1-9  
*The Spirit and water and blood.*

Gospel Acclamation: **Alleluia, alleluia! John saw Jesus coming towards him, and said: This is the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world. Alleluia!**

Gospel: Mark 1:7-11  
*You are my Son, the Beloved; my favour rests on you.*

The **Creed** is said.

Communion Antiphon: **Behold the One of whom John said: I have seen and testified that this is the Son of God.**

**Tuesday, 9<sup>th</sup> January**

**Weekday**

Entrance Antiphon: **Upon a lofty throne, I saw a man seated, whom a host of angels adore, singing in unison: Behold him, the name of whose empire is eternal.**

First Reading: 1 Samuel 1:9-20  
*The Lord was mindful of Hannah and she gave birth to Samuel.*

Responsorial Psalm: **My heart exults in the Lord.**

Gospel Acclamation: **Alleluia, alleluia! Accept and submit to the word which has been planted in you and can save your souls. Alleluia!**

Gospel: Mark 1:21-28  
*He taught them with authority.*

Communion Antiphon: **With you, O Lord, is the fountain of life, and in your light we see light.**

### Wednesday, 10<sup>th</sup> January

#### Weekday

Entrance Antiphon: **Upon a lofty throne, I saw a man seated, whom a host of angels adore, singing in unison: Behold him, the name of whose empire is eternal.**

First Reading: 1 Samuel 3:1-10. 19-20  
*Speak, Lord, your servant is listening.*

Responsorial Psalm: **Here I am Lord! I come to do your will.**

Gospel Acclamation: **Alleluia, alleluia! Let the message of Christ, in all its richness, find a home with you; through him give thanks to God the Father. Alleluia!**

Gospel: Mark 1:29-39  
*He cured many who were suffering from diseases of one kind or another.*

Communion Antiphon: **With you, O Lord, is the fountain of life, and in your light we see light.**

### Thursday, 11<sup>th</sup> January

#### Weekday

Entrance Antiphon: **Upon a lofty throne, I saw a man seated, whom a host of angels adore, singing in unison: Behold him, the name of whose empire is eternal.**

First Reading: 1 Samuel 4:1-11  
*Israel was defeated and the ark of God was captured.*

Responsorial Psalm: **Redeem us, O Lord, because of your love.**

Gospel Acclamation: **Alleluia, alleluia! Because of your love give me life, and I will do your will. Alleluia!**

Gospel: Mark 1:40-45  
*The leprosy left him and he was cured.*

Communion Antiphon: **With you, O Lord, is the fountain of life, and in your light we see light.**

### Friday, 12<sup>th</sup> January

#### Weekday or

#### St Aelred of Rievaulx, Abbot

*Aelred was so attracted to the Cistercian monastery of Rievaulx (Yorkshire) that he became a monk and, eventually, Abbot of the community. He was renowned for his spiritual writing, especially regarding friendship. He died in 1167.*

Entrance Antiphon: **Upon a lofty throne, I saw a man seated, whom a host of angels adore, singing in unison: Behold him, the name of whose empire is eternal.**

First Reading: 1 Samuel 8:4-7. 10-22  
*You will cry out on account of the king you have chosen for yourselves, but God will not answer you.*

Responsorial Psalm: **I will sing for ever of your love, O Lord.**

Gospel Acclamation: **Alleluia, alleluia! May the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ enlighten the eyes of our mind, so that we can see what hope his call holds for us. Alleluia!**

Gospel: Mark 2:1-12  
*The Son of Man has authority on earth to forgive sins.*

Communion Antiphon: **With you, O Lord, is the fountain of life, and in your light we see light.**
