**Saturday, 27<sup>th</sup> January**

**Weekday or**

**Blessed Edward Oldcorne, Martyr**

*Edward was a Yorkshireman who became a Jesuit whilst studying for the priesthood in Rome. He returned to Worcestershire as a priest, ministering for 18 years, before being captured in 1606. He was tried for treason and executed at Red Hill in Worcester.*

Entrance Antiphon: **O sing a new song to the Lord; sing to the Lord, all the earth. In his presence are majesty and splendour, strength and honour in his holy place.**

Edward Antiphon: **He is a true martyr who shed his blood for Christ, his judges could not shake him by their menaces, and so he won through to the Kingdom of heaven.**

First Reading: 2 Samuel 12:1-7. 10-17  
*I have sinned against the Lord.*

Responsorial Psalm: **A pure heart create for me, O God.**

Gospel Acclamation: **Alleluia, alleluia! Instruct me, Lord, in your way; on an even path lead me. Alleluia!**

Gospel: Mark 4:35-41  
*Who can this be? Even the wind and the sea obey him.*

Communion Antiphon: **Look toward the Lord and be radiant; let your faces not be abashed.**

Edward Antiphon: **I am the vine and you are the branches, says the Lord; he who lives in me, and I in him will bear much fruit.**

**Monday, 22nd January**

**Weekday or  
St Vincent, Deacon & Martyr**

*St Vincent was a deacon in Saragossa, Spain. He suffered martyrdom at Valencia during the Diocletian persecution around the year 304. He was Spain's first martyr and is patron of Valencia, Lisbon and wine-makers*

Entrance Antiphon: **O sing a new song to the Lord; sing to the Lord, all the earth. In his presence are majesty and splendour, strength and honour in his holy place.**

First Reading: 2 Samuel 5:1-7. 10  
*You shall be shepherd of my people Israel.*

Responsorial Psalm: **My truth and my love shall be with him.**

Gospel Acclamation: **Alleluia, alleluia! Teach me your paths, my God, make me walk in your truth. Alleluia!**

Gospel: Mark 3:22-30  
*It is the end of Satan.*

Communion Antiphon: **Look toward the Lord and be radiant; let your faces not be abashed.**

**Tuesday, 23rd January**

**Weekday or**

**Saint Nicholas Owen, Martyr**

*Nicholas Owen was captured on 23 January 1606 at Hindlip House in Worcester and died during brutal torture on 2 March. Working with the Jesuits, Nicholas constructed many priest-holes using his many gifts. In 1600 he became a lay Jesuit brother.*

Entrance Antiphon: **O sing a new song to the Lord; sing to the Lord, all the earth. In his presence are majesty and splendour, strength and honour in his holy place.**

First Reading: 2 Samuel 6:12-15. 17-19  
*David and all the house of Israel brought up the ark of the Lord with acclaim.*

Responsorial Psalm: **Who is the king of glory? He, the Lord, he is the king of glory.**

Gospel Acclamation: **Alleluia, alleluia! Let your face shine on your servant, and teach me your decrees. Alleluia!**

Gospel: Mark 3:31-35  
*Anyone who does the will of God, that person is my brother and sister and mother.*

Communion Antiphon: **Look toward the Lord and be radiant; let your faces not be abashed.**

**Wednesday, 24<sup>th</sup> January**

**Saint Francis de Sales, Bishop**

*Francis died in 1622 whilst Bishop of Geneva. He is noted as a spiritual director and author. He founded, with St Jane Frances de Chantal, the Visitation Sisters.*

Entrance Antiphon: **The Lord chose him for himself as high priest, and, opening his treasure house, made him rich in all good things.**

First Reading: 2 Samuel 7:4-17  
*Your House and your sovereignty will always stand secure before me.*

Responsorial Psalm: **I will keep my love for him always.**

Gospel Acclamation: **Alleluia, alleluia! Speak, Lord, your servant is listening: you have the message of eternal life. Alleluia!**

Gospel: Mark 4:1-20  
*Imagine a sower going out to sow.*

Communion Antiphon: **Look toward the Lord and be radiant; let your faces not be abashed.**



**Thursday, 25<sup>th</sup> January**

**THE CONVERSION OF  
SAINT PAUL THE APOSTLE**

Entrance Antiphon: **I know the one in whom I have believed and I am sure that he, the just judge, the mighty, will keep safe what is my due until that day.**

The **Gloria** is said.

First Reading: Acts 22:3-16  
*It is time you were baptised and had your sins washed away while invoking the name of Jesus.*

Alternative First Reading: Acts 9:1.22  
*Lord, what will you have me do?*

Responsorial Psalm: **Go out to the whole world; proclaim the Good News.**

Gospel Acclamation: **Alleluia, alleluia! I chose you from the world, to go out and to bear fruit, fruit that will last says the Lord. Alleluia!**

Gospel: Mark 16:15-18  
*Go out to the whole world; proclaim the Good News.*

Communion Antiphon: **I live by faith in the Son of God, who has loved me and given himself up for me.**

**Friday, 26<sup>th</sup> January**

**Saints Timothy and Titus, Bishops**

*Timothy and Titus were companions of St Paul. He addressed letters to them. Timothy was a bishop in Ephesus and Titus a bishop in Crete. Timothy is reputed to be the favourite disciple of Paul and was born of a Greek father and Jewish mother, whereas Titus came from a pagan family and converted to Christianity during Paul's first missionary journey.*

Entrance Antiphon: **Tell among the nations his glory, and his wonders among all the peoples, for the Lord is great and highly to be praised.**

NB First Reading is proper to the Feast

First Reading: 2 Timothy 1:1-8  
*I am reminded of the sincere faith which you have.*

Alternative First Reading: Titus 1:1-5  
*To Titus, true child of mine in the faith that we share.*
