ST PAUL'S FIRST LETTER TO THE CORINTHIANS

The Sundays between Epiphany and Ash Wednesday are the first series of Sundays I "Ordinary Time". For this group of Sundays, the Lectionary always selects from the First Letter to the Corinthians, choosing from chapters 1-5, 6-10 and 11-15, according to the year. The readings begin next week, January 14th. Corinth was an important port, banking and trading centre. Paul spent nearly two years there, 50-51AD. It was a newly rebuilt city and attracted a varied population, including Christians expelled from Rome. Paul was born into the Jewish community of Tarsus. His family moved to Jerusalem when he was a boy. There he assiduously studied the faith of Israel with the Pharisees and learned his trade as a tent-maker. His zeal for the faith was outstanding. He was a product of the Graeco-Roman world and the Jewish world.
