**Monday, 26<sup>th</sup> February**

**Weekday in Lent**

Entrance Antiphon: **Redeem me, O Lord, and have mercy on me. My foot stands on level ground; I will bless the Lord in the assembly.**

First Reading: Daniel 9:4-10  
*We have sinned, we have done wrong.*

Responsorial Psalm: **Do not treat us according to our sins, O Lord.**

Gospel Acclamation: **Praise and honour to you, Lord Jesus! The seed is the word of God, Christ the sower, whoever finds this seed will remain for ever. Praise and honour to you, Lord Jesus!**

Gospel: Luke 6:36-38  
*Grant pardon, and you will be pardoned.*

Communion Antiphon: **Be merciful, as your Father is merciful, says the Lord.**

Tuesday, 27<sup>th</sup> February

**Weekday in Lent**

Entrance Antiphon: **Give light to my eyes lest I fall asleep in death, lest my enemies say: I have overcome him.**

First Reading: Isaiah 1:10. 16-20  
*Learn to do good, search for justice.*

Responsorial Psalm: **I will show God's salvation to the upright.**

Gospel Acclamation: **Glory and praise to you, O Christ! Repent, says the Lord, for the kingdom of heaven is close at hand. Glory and praise to you, O Christ!**

Gospel: Matthew 23:1-12  
*They do not practise what they preach.*

Communion Antiphon: **I will recount all your wonders. I will rejoice in you and be glad, and sing psalms to your name, O Most High.**

Wednesday, 28<sup>th</sup> February

**Weekday in Lent**

**Comm. St Oswald, Bishop (Worcs)**

*Oswald was a Benedictine monk of the abbey of Fleury-sur-loire and became the Bishop of Worcester in 961. He worked with St Dunstan and St Ethelwold for the restoration of the monastic life. Oswald was renowned for his pleasant character, his meticulous celebration of the sacraments and his care of the poor. In 972 he was appointed Archbishop of York and administered both dioceses. He died in Worcester on this day in 992.*

Entrance Antiphon: **Forsake me not, O Lord! My God, be not far from me! Make haste and come to my help, O Lord, my strong salvation!**

First Reading: Jeremiah 18:18-20  
*Come on, let us hit at him.*

Responsorial Psalm: **Save me in your love, O Lord.**

Gospel Acclamation: **Glory to you, O Christ, you are the Word of God! Your words are spirit, Lord, and they are life; you have the message of eternal life. Glory to you, O Christ, you are the Word of God!**

Gospel: Matthew 20:17-28  
*They will condemn him to death.*

Communion Antiphon: **The Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many.**

Thursday, 1<sup>st</sup> March

**Weekday in Lent**

**SAINT DAVID, BISHOP  
AND PATRON OF WALES**

*David was a monk and Bishop of Menevia. He was very much a man of prayer who led an austere life. He died at the end of the 6<sup>th</sup> century.*

Entrance Antiphon: **How beautiful upon the mountains are the feet of him who brings glad tidings of peace, bearing good news, announcing salvation!**

The **Gloria** is said.

First Reading: Philippians 3:8-14  
*I am racing for the finish, for the prize to which God calls us upwards to receive in Christ Jesus.*

Responsorial Psalm: **Happy the man who has placed his trust in the Lord.**

Gospel Acclamation: **If you make my word your home you will indeed be my disciples, and you will learn the truth, says the Lord.**

Gospel: Matthew 5:13-16  
*You are the light of the world.*

Communion Antiphon: **We proclaim Christ crucified; Christ, the power of God and the wisdom of God.**

Friday, 2<sup>nd</sup> March

**SAINT CHAD, BISHOP  
AND PATRON OF THE DIOCESE**

*Chad was one of the first Bishops of Mercia and Lindsey and had his See at Lichfield. He was a bishop for only three years but his reputation as a humble, devout and zealous bishop meant that when he died in 672 his tomb quickly became a place of pilgrimage and prayer.*
