Communion Antiphon: **Be built up like living stones, into a spiritual house, a holy priesthood.**

Saturday, 10th November

**St Leo the Great,
Pope & Doctor of the Church**

Leo died in 461. He was an eminent pastor and preacher. Twice he saved Rome from Barbarian invasion and his formulation of Christ's two natures was adopted by the Council of Chalcedon.

Entrance Antiphon: **The Lord established for him a covenant of peace, and made him the prince, that he might have the dignity of the priesthood for ever.**

First Reading: Philippians 4:10-19

There is nothing I cannot master with the help of the One who gives me strength.

Responsorial Psalm: **Happy the man who fears the Lord.**

Gospel Acclamation: **Alleluia, alleluia! Open our hearts, O Lord, to accept the words of your Son. Alleluia!**

Gospel: Luke 16:9-15

If you cannot be trusted with money, that tainted thing, who will trust you with genuine riches?

Communion Antiphon: **Peter said to Jesus: You are the Christ, the Son of the living God. And Jesus replied: You are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my Church.**

Gospel: Luke 14:15-24

Go to the open roads and the hedgerows and force people to come in to make sure my house is full.

Communion Antiphon: **You will show me the path of life, the fullness of joy in your presence, O Lord.**

Wednesday, 7th November

**Weekday or
St Willibrord, Bishop**

Willibrord died in 739. His life exemplifies the virtues of patience and resignation to the will of God. It was his unhappy fate to see much of his life's work swept away after years of missionary labour, yet he never became daunted. He continued to work tirelessly in his task of preaching the Gospel, and trusted in the providence of God to make all things well in the end.

Entrance Antiphon: **Forsake me not, O Lord, my God; be not far from me! Make haste and come to my help, O Lord, my strong salvation!**

First Reading: Philippians 2:12-18

Work for your salvation. It is God who puts both the will and the action into you.

Responsorial Psalm: **The Lord is my light and my help.**

Gospel Acclamation: **Alleluia, alleluia! Because of your love give me life, and I will do your will. Alleluia!**

Gospel: Luke 14:25-33

None of you can be my disciple unless he gives up all his possessions.

Communion Antiphon: **You will show me the path of life, the fullness of joy in your presence, O Lord.**

Thursday, 8th November

Bl. George Napier, Priest and Martyr**

George died in 1610. He was born in Oxford and educated at Douai. For seven years he carried out his priestly work in England before being martyred.

Entrance Antiphon: **Forsake me not, O Lord, my God; be not far from me! Make haste and come to my help, O Lord, my strong salvation!**

George Antiphon: **The Holy Martyrs shed their blood on earth for Christ; therefore they have received an everlasting reward.**

First Reading: Philippians 3:3-8

Because of Christ, I have come to consider all the advantages that I had as disadvantages.

Responsorial Psalm: **Let the hearts that seek the Lord rejoice.**

Gospel Acclamation: **Alleluia, alleluia! My soul is waiting for the Lord, I count on his word. Alleluia!**

Gospel: Luke 15:1-10

There will be rejoicing in heaven over one repentant sinner.

Communion Antiphon: **You will show me the path of life, the fullness of joy in your presence, O Lord.**

George Antiphon: **I am the vine and you are the branches, says the Lord; he who lives in me, and I in him will bear much fruit.**

Friday, 9th November

**THE DEDICATION OF THE LATERAN
BASILICA**

The basilica of John Lateran is the Cathedral Church of Rome. It was built by the Emperor Constantine and is the 'Mother Church' of the city and the world.

Entrance Antiphon: **I saw the holy city, a new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, prepared like a bride adorned for her husband.**
