Saturday, 17th November

St Elizabeth of Hungary, Religious or
Saint Hilda, Religious or
St Huga of Lincoln, Bishop or
Our Lady on Saturday**

Elizabeth was married and widowed at a very young age. She died in 1231 at the age of 24 leaving three sons. She was a Franciscan tertiary who was devoted to the poor. Five years after her death she was canonised.

Hilda died in 680. She hosted the Synod of Whitby and was the Abbess of a double monastery, of both monks and nuns.

Hugh entered the Grand Chartreuse of Grenoble at the age of 25. Being sent to England to be Prior he was, however, appointed Bishop of Lincoln. He gained a reputation for justice, care of the sick, and supporting the oppressed.

First Reading: 3 John 5-8

It is our duty to welcome men of this sort and contribute our share to their work for the truth.

Gospel: Luke 18:1-8

God will see justice done to his chosen who cry to him.

Monday, 12th November

St Josaphat, Bishop & Martyr

Josaphat died in 1626. Having been brought up a Ukrainian Orthodox he became a month of the Rathenian rite, in communion with Rome. Being appointed Archbishop of Podolsk he worked tirelessly to bring about a reunion between Orthodox Churches and Rome. He was murdered, however, by those who were opposed to his work.

Entrance Antiphon: **Because of the Lord's covenant and the ancestral laws, the Saints of God persevered in loving brotherhood, for there was always one spirit in them, and one faith.**

First Reading: Titus 1:1-9

Appoint elders in the way that I told you.

Responsorial Psalm: **Such are the men who seek your face, O Lord.**

Gospel Acclamation: **Alleluia, alleluia! You will shine in the world like bright stars because you are offering it the word of life. Alleluia!**

Gospel: Luke 17:1-6

If your brother comes back to you seven times a day and says, 'I am sorry,' you must forgive him.

Communion Antiphon: **Whoever loses his life for my sake, will find it in eternity, says the Lord.**

Tuesday, 13th November

Entrance Antiphon: **Let my prayer come into your presence. Incline your ear to my cry for help, O Lord.**

First Reading: Titus 2:1-8. 11-14

We must live religious lives while we are waiting in hope for the blessing which will come with the Appearing of our God and saviour Christ Jesus.

Responsorial Psalm: The salvation of the just comes from the Lord.

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia! Man does not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes from the mouth of God. Alleluia!

Gospel: Luke 17:7-10
We are merely servants: we have done no more than our duty.

Communion Antiphon: The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want. Fresh and green are the pastures where he gives me repose, near restful waters he leads me.

Wednesday, 14th November

Entrance Antiphon: Let my prayer come into your presence. Incline your ear to my cry for help, O Lord.

First Reading: Titus 3:1-7
We were misled, but because of his compassion God saved us.

Responsorial Psalm: The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want.

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia! Through the Good News God called us to share the glory of our Lord Jesus Christ. Alleluia!

Gospel: Luke 17:11-19
No one has come back to give praise to God, except this foreigner.

Communion Antiphon: The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want. Fresh and green are the pastures where he gives me repose, near restful waters he leads me.

Thursday, 15th November

St Albert the Great, Bishop and
Doctor of the Church**

Albert died at Cologne in 1280. A Dominican who was appointed Bishop of Ratisbon. He was a prolific writer specialising in natural sciences, philosophy and theology.

Entrance Antiphon: Let my prayer come into your presence. Incline your ear to my cry for help, O Lord.

First Reading: Philemon 7-20
Have him back, not as a slave any more, but as a dear brother.

Responsorial Psalm: He is happy who is helped by Jacob's God.

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia! The word of the Lord remains for ever: What is the word? It is the Good News that has been brought to you. Alleluia!

Gospel: Luke 17:20-25
The kingdom of God is among you.

Communion Antiphon: The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want. Fresh and green are the pastures where he gives me repose, near restful waters he leads me.

Friday, 16th November

**Weekday or
St Edmund of Abingdon, Bishop or
St Margaret of Scotland or
St Gertrude, Virgin**

Edmund died in 1240. He was a reforming Bishop and peacemaker who was Archbishop of Canterbury.

Margaret died in 1093. She was married to King Malcolm III of Scotland and had eight children. She was renowned for her love and care of the poor. She is Secondary Patron of Scotland.

Gertrude died in 1301. Being entrusted to nuns at the age of five she became a mystic who fostered devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

Entrance Antiphon: Let my prayer come into your presence. Incline your ear to my cry for help, O Lord.

First Reading: 2 John 4-9
Only those who keep to what he taught can have the Father and Son with them.

Responsorial Psalm: They are happy who follow God's law.

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia! The word of God is something alive and active; it can judge secret emotions and thoughts. Alleluia!
