



**Saturday, 1<sup>st</sup> December**

**St Edmund Campion, Priest & Martyr**

*Edmund was born in 1540 in London. He studied at Oxford and took the Oath of Supremacy but later recanted and returned to Catholicism. He joined the Jesuits, was ordained a priest and, three years later, was martyred on this day in 1581 at Tyburn Hill.*

Entrance Antiphon: **We are given over to death for Jesus, that the life of Jesus may be revealed in our mortal flesh.**

First Reading: 1 Corinthians 4:9-13  
*We have been put on show in front of the whole universe.*

Responsorial Psalm: **Together let us praise the name of the Lord.**

Gospel Acclamation: **Alleluia, alleluia! When the storm is over the wicked man is no more, but the virtuous stand firm for ever. Alleluia!**

Gospel: Luke 9:23-26  
*What gain for a man to have won the whole world and to have lost his very self.*

Communion Antiphon: **Neither death nor life nor anything in all creation can come between us and Christ's love for us.**

**Monday, 26<sup>th</sup> November**

**Weekday**

Entrance Antiphon: **The Lord speaks of peace to his people and his holy ones and to those who turn to him.**

First Reading: Apocalypse 14:1-5  
*The name of Christ and his Father's name written on their foreheads.*

Responsorial Psalm: **Such are the men who seek your face, O Lord.**

Gospel Acclamation: **Alleluia, alleluia! Even if you have to die, says the Lord, keep faithful, and I will give you the crown of life. Alleluia!**

Gospel: Luke 21:1-4  
*He noticed a poverty-stricken widow putting in two small coins.*

Communion Antiphon: **O praise the Lord, all you nations, for his merciful love towards us is great.**

**Tuesday, 27<sup>th</sup> November**

**Weekday**

Entrance Antiphon: **The Lord speaks of peace to his people and his holy ones and to those who turn to him.**

First Reading: Apocalypse 14:14-19  
*Harvest time has come, and the harvest of the earth is ripe.*

Responsorial Psalm: **The Lord comes to rule the earth.**

Gospel Acclamation: **Alleluia, alleluia! Stand erect, hold your heads high, because your liberation is near at hand. Alleluia!**

Gospel: Luke 21:5-11  
*Not a single stone will be left on another.*

Communion Antiphon: **O praise the Lord, all you nations, for his merciful love towards us is great.**

**Wednesday, 28<sup>th</sup> November**

**Weekday**

Entrance Antiphon: **The Lord speaks of peace to his people and his holy ones and to those who turn to him.**

First Reading: Apocalypse 15:1-4  
*They were singing the hymn of Moses and of the Lamb.*

Responsorial Psalm: **How great and wonderful are all your works, Lord God almighty.**

Gospel Acclamation: **Alleluia, alleluia! Stay awake, praying at all times for the strength to stand with confidence before the Son of Man. Alleluia!**

Gospel: Luke 21:12-19  
*You will be hated by all men on account of my name, but not a hair of your head will be lost.*

Communion Antiphon: **O praise the Lord, all you nations, for his merciful love towards us is great.**

**Thursday, 29<sup>th</sup> November**

**Weekday**

Entrance Antiphon: **The Lord speaks of peace to his people and his holy ones and to those who turn to him.**

First Reading: Apocalypse 18:1-2. 21-23; 19:1-3. 9  
*Babylon the Great has fallen.*

Responsorial Psalm: **Happy are those who are invited to the wedding feast of the Lamb.**

Gospel Acclamation: **Alleluia, alleluia! Stay awake and stand ready, because you do not know the hour when the Son of Man is coming. Alleluia!**

Gospel: Luke 21:20-28  
*Jerusalem will be trampled down by the pagans until the age of the pagans is completely over.*

Communion Antiphon: **O praise the Lord, all you nations, for his merciful love towards us is great.**



**Friday, 30<sup>th</sup> November**

**SAINT ANDREW, APOSTLE  
PATRON OF SCOTLAND**

*Andrew lived in the first century: a fisherman by trade, together with his brother Simon. He was called by Christ to one of the twelve. According to Tradition he preached the Gospel in Greece, where he was martyred. St Andrew is the patron of Greece and Scotland, amongst other places.*

Entrance Antiphon: **Beside the Sea of Galilee, the Lord saw two brothers, Peter and Andrew, and he said to them: Come after me and I will make you fishers of men.**

The **Gloria** is said.

First Reading: Romans 10:9-18  
*Faith comes from what is preached, and what is preached comes from the word of Christ.*

Responsorial Psalm: **Their word goes forth through all the earth.**

Gospel Acclamation: **Alleluia, alleluia! Follow me, says the Lord, and I will make you into fishers of men. Alleluia!**

Gospel: Matthew 4:18-22  
*And they left their nets at once and followed him.*

Communion Antiphon: **Andrew told his brother Simon: We have found the Messiah, the Christ, and he brought him to Jesus.**
