

St. Edward the Confessor
13th October

Fleeing England at the age 9, St. Edward returned at the age of 40 to become one of England's most beloved kings. After the Danish invasion of England in 1013 Edward escaped to Normandy. While there he made a vow to St. Peter, promising that if he ever regained his kingdom he would go on a pilgrimage to the saint's tomb in Rome. In 1042 Edward regained the throne, but could not go on his pilgrimage without risking a possible civil war between his people. Hearing of this the Pope agreed to release St. Edward of this vow if he restored the abbey of St. Peter in Westminster. Edward agreed and built a huge Romanesque church - at the time one of the largest in Europe - which we know as Westminster Abbey. Unfortunately St. Edward died on 5 January 1066 just 8 days prior to the consecration of the church.
