SUNDAY MASSES IN ADVENT Our Sunday Masses during Advent will be celebrated according to Divine Worship, the Eucharistic liturgy distinctive to the ordinariate. Advent begins two weeks today.

FEAST OF CHRIST THE KING Next Sunday's celebration of Christ the King is the last Sunday of this Church year. The following Sunday, 3rd December, is the First Sunday of Advent, which marks the beginning of a new year..

READERS If you read at Mass please remember to speak slowly and clearly, not relying on the microphone but projecting your voice to the back of church. People in the congregation do not have the texts in front of them; they are relying on you to proclaim the word of God to them. Please remember too to leave a pause at the end of each reading before concluding, 'The word of the Lord'. Readers at weekday Masses should also take care to 'announce' the psalm response audibly; otherwise the congregation is left unable to respond to each section of the psalm. Similarly, the Gospel acclamation needs to be loud and clear. At this point the congregation is rising to its feet and often making some noise, so make sure your acclamation is heard.

ASSOCIATE MEMBERSHIP OF THE ORDINARIATE The Ordinariate has launched a new initiative which enables Catholics who are not members of the Ordinariate nevertheless to identify more closely with the life and mission of the ordinariate, by way of support, both in prayer and in other ways.
