

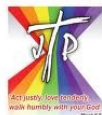

The View from the pew!

A priest sent out a survey to all his parish staff and other leaders who served as volunteers for the many liturgical, catechetical, and pastoral ministries to find out their perception of the quality of its liturgies. In general, most of them ranked their liturgies high. They saw their music as excellent in encouraging assembly participation and the preaching well above average and connected in the lives of the parishioners. They concluded their remarks by saying that they are truly a welcoming community. The same survey was sent to anyone in the pews on few Sundays to have a wide range of responses from long-time parishioners, newcomers, one-time visitors, and back-ran Catholics. The result was different. They agreed that the music was generally good, but most of the time they just listened because they didn't really know the songs or feel encouraged to sing. Most of them couldn't say how the homily connected to their lives, but they enjoyed the jokes of the priest. But they felt welcomed only by people they came with, family and friends, and not one else talked to them after Mass or personally invited them to some other parish activities beyond Mass.

Our point of view in the liturgy matters. If we are regularly up in front, at a microphone, or in a position of authority in the parish, we will see a whole different view of the Sunday Mass than the person who sit at the back row, or is there only because of culture, obligation, or habit. Neither perspective is a complete or accurate assessment of the parish or of what the parish does on Sunday. But our responsibilities as pastoral leaders are to try to break out of our familiarity and bias with our experience and to see our parish liturgy from the perspective of those who are most often left out in the decision-making and whose voices are never heard or solicited – the outsider, the visitors, the seeker, the immigrant, and the ones we label as uninterested or committed. Mass is an assembly of God's worthy and unworthy people who come to him in thanksgiving and renewal.
