**St Chad, Bishop (Diocesan Supplement)  
Patron of the Diocese**

*Chad was one of the first Bishops of Mercia and Lindsey and has his See at Lichfield. He was a bishop for only three years but his reputation as a humble, devout and zealous bishop meant that when he died in 672, his tomb quickly became a place of pilgrimage and prayer.*

Entrance Antiphon: **My words that I have put in your mouth, says the Lord, will never be absent from your lips, and your gifts will be accepted on my altar.**

The **Gloria** is said.

First Reading: Romans 12:3-13  
*Our gifts differ according to grace given us.*

Responsorial Psalm: **You are my inheritance, O Lord.**

Gospel Acclamation: **Alleluia, alleluia! The Lord has sent me to bring the good news to the poor, to proclaim liberty to captives. Alleluia!**

Gospel: Luke 10:1-9  
*The harvest is rich but the labourers are few.*

Communion Antiphon: **The Son of Man came to give his life as a ransom for many.**

Entrance Antiphon: **O Lord, I trust in your merciful love. My heart will rejoice in your salvation. I will sing to the Lord who has been bountiful with me.**

First Reading: Ecclesiasticus 1:1-10  
*Before all other things, wisdom was created.*

Responsorial Psalm: **The Lord is king, with majesty enrobed.**

Gospel Acclamation: **Alleluia, alleluia! The word of the Lord remains for ever: What is this word? It is the Good News that has been brought to you. Alleluia!**

Gospel: Mark 9:14-29  
*I do have faith. Help the little faith I have.*

Communion Antiphon: **I will recount all your wonders, I will rejoice in you and be glad, and sing psalms to your name, O Most High.**

**Tuesday, 26<sup>th</sup> Feb**

Entrance Antiphon: **O Lord, I trust in your merciful love. My heart will rejoice in your salvation. I will sing to the Lord who has been bountiful with me.**

First Reading: Ecclesiasticus 2:1-11  
*Prepare yourself for an ordeal.*

Responsorial Psalm: **Commit your life to the Lord, trust him and he will act.**

Gospel Acclamation: **Alleluia, alleluia! If anyone loves me he will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we shall come to him. Alleluia!**

Gospel: Mark 9:30-37

*The Son of Man will be delivered into the hands of men. If anyone wants to be first, he must make himself the last of all.*

Communion Antiphon: **I will recount all your wonders, I will rejoice in you and be glad, and sing psalms to your name, O Most High.**

**Wednesday, 27th Feb**

Entrance Antiphon: **O Lord, I trust in your merciful love. My heart will rejoice in your salvation. I will sing to the Lord who has been bountiful with me.**

First Reading: Ecclesiasticus 4:11-19  
*The Lord loves those who love wisdom.*

Responsorial Psalm: **The lovers of your law have great peace, O Lord.**

Gospel Acclamation: **Alleluia, alleluia! I am the Way, the Truth and the Life, says the Lord; no one can come to the Father except through me. Alleluia!**

Gospel: Mark 9:38-40  
*Anyone who is not against us is for us.*

Communion Antiphon: **I will recount all your wonders, I will rejoice in you and be glad, and sing psalms to your name, O Most High.**

**Thursday, 28th Feb**

**Weekday or in Worcestershire  
St Oswald, Bishop**

*Oswald was a Benedictine monk who became Bishop of Worcester in 961. He worked with St Dunstan and St Ethelwold for the restoration of the monastic life. He was renowned for his pleasant character, his meticulous celebration of the sacraments and his care of the poor. He died in Worcester in 992.*

Entrance Antiphon: **O Lord, I trust in your merciful love. My heart will rejoice in your salvation. I will sing to the Lord who has been bountiful with me.**

Oswald Antiphon: **The Lord gave him the priesthood among the people, he clothed him with a robe of glory.**

First Reading: Ecclesiasticus 5:1-8  
*Do not delay your return to the Lord.*

Responsorial Psalm: **Happy the man who has placed his trust in the Lord.**

Gospel Acclamation: **Alleluia, alleluia! Blessed are those who, with a noble and generous heart, take the word of God to themselves and yield a harvest through their perseverance. Alleluia!**

Gospel: Mark 9:41-50  
*It is better to enter into life crippled, than to have two hands and go to hell.*

Communion Antiphon: **I will recount all your wonders, I will rejoice in you and be glad, and sing psalms to your name, O Most High.**

Oswald Antiphon: **Blessed is the servant whom the Lord finds watching when he comes; truly I tell you, he will set him over all his possessions.**

**Friday, 1st March**

**SAINT DAVID,  
BISHOP AND PATRON OF WALES**

*David was a monk and Bishop of Menevia. He was very much a man of prayer who led an austere life. He died at the end of the 6th century.*

Entrance Antiphon: **How beautiful upon the mountains are the feet of him who brings glad tidings of peace, bearing good news, announcing salvation!**

The **Gloria** is said.

First Reading: Philippians 3:8-14  
*I am racing for the finish, for the prize to which God calls us upwards to receive in Christ Jesus.*

Responsorial Psalm: **Happy the man who has placed his trust in the Lord.**

Gospel Acclamation: **Alleluia, alleluia! If you make my word your home you will indeed be my disciples, and you will learn the truth, says the Lord. Alleluia, alleluia!**

Gospel: Matthew 5:13-16  
*You are the light of the world.*
