Monday 11th February The Feast of Our lady of Lourdes and World day for the Sick

According to Wikipedia, the Roman Catholic Church is the largest non-government provider of health care services in the world.

It has around 18,000 clinics, 16,000 homes for the elderly and those with special needs, and 5,500 hospitals, with 65 percent of them located in developing countries.

In 2010, the Church's Pontifical Council for the Pastoral Care of Health Care Workers said that the Church manages 26% of the world's health care facilities. The Church's involvement in health care has ancient origins.

Jesus Christ, ... instructed his followers to heal the sick.

For I was hungry and you fed me, thirsty and you gave me drink. I was a stranger and you received me in your homes. Naked and you clothed me. I was sick and you took care of me, in prison and you visited me ... [W]hatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me. (Mt 25)

The early Christians were noted for tending the sick and infirm, and Christian emphasis on practical charity gave rise to the development of systematic nursing and hospitals.

The influential Benedictine rule holds that "the care of the sick is to be placed above and before every other duty, as if indeed Christ were being directly served by waiting on them".

During the Middle Ages, monasteries and convents were the key medical centres of Europe and the Church developed an early version of a welfare state.

The principles at the heart of the Church's teaching is we believe that each person is created in God's image. By taking on our human nature, that is, by fully sharing our life, the eternal Son of God taught us how precious each human life really is in His Father's eyes. Our God in heaven knows and loves each one of us. What happens to us on this earth matters to Him. The Lord is especially close to the vulnerable and suffering. Contemplating our crucified Saviour, we can regard no human life as useless or burdensome. Each person is precious in God's eyes and called to eternal life and joy. This is the basis for the Church's teaching on the dignity of the human person and our duty to foster and sustain human life. Our faith teaches us to see human life as a precious gift from God; we are not its owners but its guardians.

Let us remember then all our sick family and friends and those who care for them in a special way this Monday on the Feast of Our lady of Lourdes
