DAILY PRAYERS FOR LENT Please take with you today the booklet of daily prayers for the first week of Lent. I encourage you to set aside some time each day this week to use the prayers for each day.

CAFOD FAST DAY HUNGER LUNCH On Saturday 16th March Pat and Ian are organising a 'hunger lunch' consisting of soup and a roll, instead of the usual coffee morning. Proceeds will go to CAFOD. The CAFOD Lent fast day itself is on Friday 15th March. Please try to make this initiative a part of your Lenten exercises of prayer, fasting and almsgiving. (CAFOD is an international development charity and the official aid agency of the Catholic Church in England and Wales).

THE LENTEN EMBER DAYS Four times a year, approximately three months apart, near the beginning of each season of the solar cycle (winter, spring, summer and autumn), the Church set aside three days (a total of twelve days in a year) to ask for blessings upon mankind, and to pray in gratitude for the blessings of nature, particularly those used by the Church in her Liturgy, such as olives, grapes, and wheat. This is also a time set apart to thank God for the sacraments and pray for priests and seminarians, particularly those who are being ordained in the coming year. The ember days are marked with prayer, fasting and abstinence and stress spiritual renewal, refreshment and redirection.

CHRISM MASS The Chrism Mass for the priests and deacons of the ordinariate, takes place on Thursday 11th April at Our Lady of the Assumption, Warwick Street.
