Ministers of the Word

Those who proclaim the Word of God have an important ministry within the Church. The proclamation of the Word of God is not only important; it is also demanding. It requires an appreciation of the liturgy itself, a familiarity with the text, as well as an ability to communicate effectively in public.

The Holy Week Liturgy is both Sacred and Beautiful. Careful preparation is important. We ask all our Readers whether they are participating in the Holy Week Liturgy or not to take on board the following helpful points with charity.

Preparing to Proclaim God's word: Practical Preparation

- Acquire a copy of the readings a week previously.
- Underline key words and phrases and check out pronunciations. 2.
- Note the different types of text; poetry, narrative, dialogue etc.
- Read the text aloud; if possible ask someone to listen to you and ask for their comments.
- Ensure that the lectionary is open on the correct page and that the microphone is switched on and adjusted to the
- right height before Mass commences. Do not tap the microphone during Mass.

 The Reader must wait until the people are seated before processing forward for the First Reading.

 There is no need to say, "The first reading is...", or "the Response to the Psalm is" the assembly knows that it is the first reading, they only need to hear where the reading comes from the Psalm is a reading from the prophet Isaiah".
- After the Second reading give the Congregation time to stand before the Gospel acclamation is proclaimed. There should be time for the people to stand between "thanks be to God" and "Alleluia, Alleluia, Alleluia". 8.
- Ministers of the Word are entrusted to proclaim the Word in such a way that it makes it more comprehensible to those who listen: if the minister doesn't grasp the overall sense of the text then it will be more difficult for members of the assembly to absorb it.
- We should try and convey particular significance on words, phrases, clauses where an important point is being made. Stress can be made by inflection, tone, reducing speed, a brief pause or by looking up at the assembly.
- And finally we need to Proclaim the Word slowly and with clarity and faith-conviction in an audible voice; remember, the microphone can only do so much. We want the person on the back bench to hear as much as the person on the front bench. We cannot proclaim God's Word with our ordinary speaking voice and volume. We need to raise our voice. It might seem loud to you, but not to the person who struggles to hear. If in doubt ask for feedback.

Ministers of the Word we have the honoured task of being the mouth piece of God and our function is to provide the assembly with a meaningful encounter with the Word of God. To all our Readers, we are grateful for your Ministry and we encourage you to take on board these helpful points.
