BVM Antiphon(7): **Mary said: My spirit rejoices in God my Saviour, because the Lord has looked on his lowly handmaid.**

First Reading: Genesis 27:1-5. 15-29  
*Jacob supplanted his brother and took his brother's blessing.*

Responsorial Psalm: **Praise the Lord for the Lord is good.**

Gospel Acclamation: **Alleluia, alleluia! Let your face shine on your servant, and teach me your decrees. Alleluia!**

Gospel: Matthew 9:14-17  
*Surely the bridegroom's attendants would never think of mourning as long as the bridegroom is still with them?*

Communion Antiphon: **Bless the Lord, O my soul, and all within me, his holy name.**

**Monday, 1<sup>st</sup> July**

**Weekday or**

**St Oliver Plunket, Bishop & Martyr**

*Oliver Plunket was born into a noble Irish family. In 1669 he was appointed Archbishop of Armagh. He brought the reforms of the Council of Trent to his diocese. He was falsely implicated in the Titus Oates plot, tried and executed.*

Entrance Antiphon: **All peoples, clap your hands. Cry to God with shouts of joy!**

First Reading: Genesis 18:16-33  
*Are you going to destroy the just man with the sinner?*

Responsorial Psalm: **The Lord is compassion and love.**

Gospel Acclamation: **Alleluia, alleluia! I am the light of the world, says the Lord, anyone who follows me will have the light of life. Alleluia!**

Gospel: Matthew 8:18-22  
*Follow me.*

Communion Antiphon: **Bless the Lord, O my soul, and all within me, his holy name.**

Tuesday, 2<sup>nd</sup> July

Entrance Antiphon: **All peoples, clap your hands. Cry to God with shouts of joy!**

First Reading: Genesis 19:15-29  
*The Lord rained brimstone and fire on Sodom and Gomorrah.*

Responsorial Psalm: **Your love, O Lord, is before my eyes.**

Gospel Acclamation: **Alleluia, alleluia! O praise the Lord, Jerusalem! He sends out his word to the earth. Alleluia!**

Gospel: Matthew 8:23-27  
*He stood up and rebuked the winds and the seas; and all was calm again.*

Communion Antiphon: **Bless the Lord, O my soul, and all within me, his holy name.**

Wednesday, 3<sup>rd</sup> July

ST THOMAS, APOSTLE

*He was also called Didymus (the twin), was ready to die with Jesus. 'Let us go, too, and die with him.' (John 11:16), he was also sceptical about the Resurrection. When the risen Lord was made clear to him, we hear his great profession of faith, 'My Lord and my God.'*

Entrance Antiphon: **You are my God, and I confess you; you are my God, and I exalt you; I will thank you, for you became my saviour.**

The **Gloria** is said.

First Reading: Ephesians 2:19-22  
*You are part of a building that has the apostles for its foundations.*

Responsorial Psalm: **Go out to the whole world; proclaim the Good News.**

Gospel Acclamation: **Alleluia, alleluia! You believe, Thomas, because you can see me, says the Lord. Happy are those who have not seen and yet believe. Alleluia!**

Gospel: John 20:24-29  
*My Lord and my God.*

Communion Antiphon: **Bring your hand and feel the place of the nails, and do not be unbelieving but believing.**

Thursday, 4<sup>th</sup> July

**St Elizabeth of Portugal**

*Elizabeth died in 1336. She was queen consort of Portugal and she lived a life of prayer and piety despite the trials and tribulations of family life. She founded orphanages and hospitals. Elizabeth was renowned not only as a peacemaker within her own family but also between nations. Her great aunt was St Elizabeth of Hungary.*

Entrance Antiphon: **All peoples, clap your hands. Cry to God with shouts of joy!**

First Reading: Genesis 22:1-19  
*The sacrifice of our father Abraham.*

Responsorial Psalm: **I will walk in the presence of the Lord in the land of the living.**

Gospel Acclamation: **Alleluia, alleluia! Blessed are you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth, for revealing the mysteries of the kingdom to mere children. Alleluia!**

Gospel: Matthew 9:1-8  
*They praised God for giving such power to men.*

Communion Antiphon: **Bless the Lord, O my soul, and all within me, his holy name.**

Friday, 5<sup>th</sup> July

Weekday or

**St Anthony Zaccaria or**

**Bl George Nichols & Comp., Martyrs or  
St Modwen, Virgin**

*Anthony died in 1539 having founded the Barnabite order with its emphasis on devotion to the Eucharist and the writings of St Paul.*

*George was arrested and executed in Oxford along with another priest and two laymen in 1589. Their feast is celebrated in Oxfordshire, especially.*

*Modwen belonged to a group of Irish hermits who worked for the conversion of Anglo-Saxons. She lived near Burton on Trent in the seventh century. Her feast is celebrated in Staffordshire, especially.*

Entrance Antiphon: **All peoples, clap your hands. Cry to God with shouts of joy!**

First Reading: Genesis 23:1-4. 19; 24:1-8. 62-67  
*Isaac loved Rebekah and so was consoled for the loss of his mother.*
