**St Henry, Holy Roman Emperor or
Votive Mass of the BVM**

Henry II died in 1024. He was good to the poor and respected the freedom of the Church whilst furthering monastic reform.

Entrance Antiphon: **Your merciful love, O God, we have received in the midst of your temple. Your praise, O God, like your name, reaches the ends of the earth; your right hand is filled with saving justice.**

BVM Antiphon(8): **Happy are you, holy Virgin Mary, and most worthy of all praise, for from you arose the sun of justice, Christ our God, through whom we have been saved and redeemed.**

First Reading: Genesis 49:29-33; 50:15-26
God will be sure to remember you kindly and take you back from this country.

Responsorial Psalm: **Seek the Lord, you who are poor, and your hearts will revive.**

Gospel Acclamation: **Alleluia, alleluia! When anyone obeys what Christ has said, God's love comes to perfection in him. Alleluia!**

Do not be afraid of those who can kill the body.

Communion Antiphon: **Taste and see that the Lord is good; blessed the man who seeks refuge in him.**

Entrance Antiphon: **Your merciful love, O God, we have received in the midst of your temple. Your praise, O God, like your name, reaches the ends of the earth; your right hand is filled with saving justice.**

St Augustine Zhao Rong & Comp, Martyrs

All these men were Chinese martyrs who died between 1648 and 1930. Augustine was a soldier who was influenced by Monsignor Dufresse and became a Christian then later a priest. He was cruelly tortured and died in 1815.

Entrance Antiphon: **Your merciful love, O God, we have received in the midst of your temple. Your praise, O God, like your name, reaches the ends of the earth; your right hand is filled with saving justice.**

First Reading: Genesis 32:23-33

Your name shall be Israel, because you have been strong against God.

Responsorial Psalm: **Lord, in my justice I shall see your face.**

Gospel Acclamation: **Alleluia, alleluia! May the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ enlighten the eyes of our mind, so that we can see what hope his call holds for us. Alleluia!**

Gospel: Matthew 9:32-38

The harvest is rich but the labourers are few.

ST BENEDICT, ABBOT & PATRON OF EUROPE

Benedict died at Monte Cassino in 550. It was here and at Subiaco that he regulated communal religious life. He wrote a 'Rule' that enables Benedictine houses to be centres of spirituality, hospitality and learning without which Western civilisation would be much impoverished.

Entrance Antiphon: **There was a man of venerable life, Benedict, blessed by grace and by name, who, leaving home and patrimony and desiring to please God alone, sought out the habit of holy living.**

The **Gloria** is said.

First Reading: Proverbs 2:1-9
Apply your heart to truth.

Responsorial Psalm: **I will bless the Lord at all times.**

Gospel Acclamation: **Alleluia, alleluia! How happy are the poor in spirit; theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Alleluia!**

Gospel: Matthew 19:27-29

You who have followed me will be repaid a hundred times over.

Communion Antiphon: **This is the steward, faithful and prudent, whom the Lord set over his household to give them their allowance of food at the proper time.**

Friday, 12th July

First Reading: Genesis 46:1-7. 28-30
