THE CHURCH'S MINISTRY TO THE SICK

“Is there anyone among you who is sick? Let them call for the elders of the church, and let them pray over them, anointing them with oil in the name of the Lord; the prayer of faith will save the sick persons, and the Lord will raise them up; and if they have committed any sins, their sins will be forgiven them.” (James 5:14-15)



It has been the practice of the Church from its earliest days to take special care of those who are sick. In Christ's name we reach out to them with his consolation; indeed, in the sick we see the suffering Christ himself.

- ❖ If you are, or know of, a sick parishioner, please **let us know**, and we will do our best to support them in the most appropriate way. You are not troubling anybody; you are doing a very loving thing. Please don't assume that somebody else has informed us.
- ❖ Those who are housebound can be taken **Holy Communion** either by one of the clergy or a lay Extraordinary Minister. In this way they can share in our common celebration of the Eucharist and be nourished by Christ's Body.
- ❖ Those who are have begun to be seriously ill or frail should receive the sacrament of **Anointing of the Sick**, where Christ gives them forgiveness of their sins and the strength to bear their illness. Anointing shouldn't be put off til the last moment, and it can be received more than once. Those going into into hospital for an **operation** may also wish to receive the Sacrament of the Sick before admission.
- ❖ We are also happy simply to visit and pray with and for those who are sick; and to celebrate the **Sacrament of Penance** (Confession) as needed.
- ❖ When somebody is nearing the end of their life, there are special prayers and rites, in particular the celebration of the Holy Communion as **Viaticum** (food for the journey), and the granting of the Apostolic Pardon. Please don't delay getting in touch if death seems to be approaching. In urgent cases it's probably best to get in touch with us by telephone (024 7667 4161).

Going into hospital?

The Catholic chaplain at University Hospital Coventry & Warwickshire in Walsgrave (and at St. Cross Hospital in Rugby) is Father Evaristus Sunday. Messages for Fr. Sunday can be left on 024 7696 7515. In an emergency contact the hospital switchboard on 024 7696 4000 (open 24 hours) and ask for the chaplain. There is always a Catholic chaplain on call. It's important to let the hospital nursing staff know at the time of admission that you (or your relative) are a Catholic and would like the Catholic chaplain to visit you while you're there.
