


Saturday, 13th June



**St Anthony of Padua, Priest
and Doctor of the Church**

Anthony was born in Lisbon in 1195 and died in Padua in 1231. He became a Franciscan and is remembered and loved as an inspired preacher, a servant of the poor and a worker of miracles.

Entrance Antiphon: Your priests, O lord, shall be clothed with justice; your holy ones shall ring out their joy.

First Reading: 1 Kings 19:19-21
Elisha rose and followed Elijah

Responsorial Psalm: **You are my inheritance, O Lord.**

Gospel Acclamation: **Alleluia, alleluia! Open my eyes, O Lord, that I may consider the wonders of you law. Alleluia!**

Gospel: Matthew 5:33-37
I say to you do not swear at all.

Communion Antiphon: **Blessed is the servant whom the Lord finds watching when he comes. Amen, I say to you: He will put that servant in charge of all his property.**

Monday, 8th June

Entrance Antiphon: **The Lord is my light and my salvation; whom shall I fear? The Lord is the stronghold of my life; whom should I dread? When those who do evil draw near, they stumble and fall.**

First Reading: 1 Kings 17:1-6
Elijah served the Lord God of Israel.

Responsorial Psalm: **Our help is in the name of the Lord, who made heaven and earth.**

Gospel Acclamation: **Alleluia, alleluia! Through the Good News God called us to share the glory of our Lord Jesus Christ. Alleluia!**

Gospel: Matthew 5:1-12
How happy are the poor in spirit.

Communion Antiphon: **The Lord is my rock, my fortress, and my deliverer; my God is my saving strength.**

Tuesday, 9th June

St Columba, Abbot or
St Ephrem, Deacon or

Columba died in 597. He was born in Donegal and was the founder of numerous Irish monasteries including Iona. He came to exercise a considerable amount of authority upon the Scottish, Irish and Northumbrian Churches.

Ephrem, a deacon and monk, led an eremitical life. He wrote many hymns to combat heresy. He was a great teacher of faith and died in 373.

First Reading: 1 Kings 17:7-16

The jar of meal was not spent, just as the Lord had foretold through Elijah.

Responsorial Psalm: **Lift up the light of your face on us, O Lord.**

Gospel Acclamation: **Alleluia, alleluia! You will shine in the world like bright stars because you are offering it the word of life. Alleluia!**

Gospel: Matthew 5:13-16
You are the light of the world.

Communion Antiphon: **The Lord is my rock, my fortress, and my deliverer; my God is my saving strength.**

Wednesday, 10th June

Entrance Antiphon: **The Lord is my light and my salvation; whom shall I fear? The Lord is the stronghold of my life; whom should I dread? When those who do evil draw near, they stumble and fall**

First Reading: 1 Kings 18:20-39
May this people know that you, Lord, are God and are winning back their hearts.

Responsorial Psalm: **Save me, Lord, I take refuge in you.**

Gospel Acclamation: **Alleluia, alleluia! Make me grasp the way of your precepts, and I will muse on your wonders. Alleluia!**

Gospel: Matthew 5:17-19
I have come not to abolish the Law of the Prophets but to complete them.

Communion Antiphon: **The Lord is my rock, my fortress, and my deliverer; my God is my saving strength.**

Thursday, 11th June

St Barnabas, Apostle

Barnabas was a Jew who came from Cyprus and became one of the first converts in Jerusalem. He introduced Paul to the Apostles and worked with him on his missions. His death is unrecorded but his remains were discovered on this day in the 5th century.

Entrance Antiphon: **Blessed is this holy man, who was worthy to be numbered among the Apostles, for he was a good man, filled with the Holy Spirit and with faith.**

The First Reading is proper to this memorial

First Reading: Acts 11:21-26; 13:1-3 (LII-1058)
He was a good man, filled with the Holy Spirit and with faith.

Responsorial Psalm: **The Lord has shown his salvation to the nations.**

Gospel Acclamation: **Alleluia, alleluia! Go, make disciples of all the nations, says the Lord; I am with you always, yes, to the end of time. Alleluia!**

Gospel: Matthew 5:20-26 (LII 583)
Anyone who is angry with his brother will answer for it before the court.

Communion Antiphon: **I no longer call you slaves, because a slave does not know what his master is doing. But I have called you friends, because I have told you everything I have heard from my Father.**

Friday, 12th June

Weekday

Entrance Antiphon: **The Lord is my light and my salvation; whom shall I fear? The Lord is the stronghold of my life; whom should I dread? When those who do evil draw near, they stumble and fall.**

First Reading: 1 Kings 19:9. 11-16
Stand on the mountain before the Lord God.

Responsorial Psalm: **It is your face, O Lord, that I seek.**

Gospel Acclamation: **Alleluia, alleluia! The sheep that belong to me listen to my voice, says the Lord, I know them and they follow me. Alleluia!**

Gospel: Matthew 5:27-32
If a man looks at a woman lustfully, he has already committed adultery.

Communion Antiphon: **The Lord is my rock, my fortress, and my deliverer; my God is my saving strength.**
