4th Sunday of Lent Yr. A

Out of Darkness

The fourth Sunday of Lent in cycle A, gives the second gospel reading from St John in as many weeks. Last week we read about the woman at the well. Next week is about the raising of Lazarus from the dead. But this week we have Jesus healing the man born blind. The story opens with the disciples – asking Jesus – *'Whose fault is it?'* that the man is blind. But Jesus rejects such attribution - It is not that bad things happen to bad people. Such thinking, which infects many religious and non-religious people, is not new in our day. Jesus is far removed from any 'prosperity gospel' (*Good things happen to those who are good*), as it might be understood today. Unfortunately, there are several on social media today, spreading wrong information about COVID -19 including Christian's Fanatics – with their false prophecy. We need to listen more to Jesus, especially in this difficult time. He comes to us with his healing power and touch. The blind man wanted to be healed and asked Jesus for healing. After his healing, those who knew him could not believe their own eyes! Indeed, they said it was not the same person. Only when the man who was formerly blind says that he is one and the same do the onlookers ask how this happened. This puzzled the Pharisees, who viewed Jesus as a sinner because he did not keep the sabbath. Yet how could a sinner make the blind see? The story continues unfolding, as those who are considered learned deny straightforward evidence that is presented to them. We may, perhaps, ask, how often do we reject plain evidence because it does not reconcile with what we 'know' to be true? It is difficult to change one's mind, especially if that means changing many other attitudes and thoughts as well. In today's gospel story, as in so many, Jesus takes the initiative. He creates cognitive dissonance in the minds and hearts of many, demanding that they make a decision for or against him. When do we face such encounters with Christ? What is our response? Do we deny what everyone can plainly see? Or do we undergo a change and enter into a new life with Christ?

Liturgical Advice: Bishops of England and Wales in the light of the COVID-19 Pandemic 18th March 2020

This advice will be reviewed and developed as necessary weekly

The Bishops' Conference of England and Wales, agreed that the cessation of public liturgies should begin from Friday evening 20th March 2020. Because of the situation the Church finds herself in, **the obligation for the faithful to attend Holy Mass on a Sunday or Holy day of Obligation is removed, until further notice.**

The following instruction is now given: Celebrations of Holy Mass (parish priest and assistant priests) who hold parochial office should continue to celebrate Mass in a church within their parish without the faithful on a daily basis.

The continuing celebration of Mass ensures that the faithful can join in spiritual communion with the priests of the Church. The Catechism of the Catholic Church states (1364): *As often as the sacrifice of the Cross by which 'Christ our Pasch has been sacrificed' is celebrated on the altar, the work of our redemption is carried out.*

Information about the live-streaming of the celebration of Mass will be made widely available in our dioceses so that the faithful can participate in the prayers of the priest at Mass at home. A fine example of this is from The National Shrine of Our Lady at Walsingham will continue its full liturgical programme and this will be available to all via the Internet (www.walsingham.org.uk) or St Elizabeth's Church **WEBCAM** is also available via <https://stelizabethcoventry.org.uk/newsletters/>.

Fr Moses will be celebrating Mass daily - especially on Wednesday 9.00am, Friday 6:30pm and Sunday 10:30am on main Altar for you to join in from home. The **Church Door will be closed 20 minutes** before the Mass starts and during the celebration of these Masses for anyone to follow on **Church's WEBCAM**, and open again after for your personal prayer.

Holy Hour and Confessions

Do you want Confessions?: If you want to do your Confessions please call to the Presbytery 024 76 68 85 36 and ask to arrange for a convenient time with Fr Moses for confession.



Adoration: This is an opportune time for more personal prayers in Church, before the Blessed Sacrament. There will be no exposition during this time, but the Church will be open everyday. **SILENCE !**
