



Almighty and eternal God, our refuge in every danger, to whom we turn in our distress; in faith we pray: look with compassion on the afflicted, grant eternal rest to the dead, comfort to mourners, healing to the sick, peace to the dying, strength to healthcare workers, wisdom to our leaders and the courage to reach out to all in love, so that together we may give glory to your holy name. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen.

Make an Act of Spiritual Communion. While you watch a live stream of Mass say the following prayer:
"My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You."

Sacrament of Reconciliation. Unfortunately, it is not possible to offer Confession at this time. Nor can the Sacrament be celebrated over the telephone or by conference call. For now, if you need to go to Confession you should make a Perfect Act of Contrition and go to Confession as soon as it becomes possible.

An Act of Contrition. *My God, I am sorry for my sins with all my heart. In choosing to do wrong and failing to do good, I have sinned against you whom I should love above all things. I firmly intend, with your help, to do penance, to sin no more, and to avoid whatever leads me to sin. Our Saviour Jesus Christ suffered and died for us. In his name, my God, have mercy.*

Corpus Christi (next Sunday, 14th June). In normal times, in the days before Corpus Christi we have the 40 Hours' Devotion – prayer before the Blessed Sacrament. Then on Corpus Christi, after the 12.30 Mass at the University, we have a Procession with the Blessed Sacrament from the Chaplaincy to St. Joseph's where we celebrate Benediction. Afterwards there is a picnic in the garden. This year, of course, we can't do that, at least, not physically. But we can take part spiritually. I shall expose the Blessed Sacrament between 10.00 and 11.00 on Thursday, Friday and Saturday this week and on Sunday, 5.00-6.00, and stream it live. We shall pray Morning or Evening Prayer of the Church during the Hour (available on Universalis.com). I invite you to spend this special time with our Lord.



Open Heaven: Prayer Walk Coventry. Open Heaven is an ecumenical initiative in Coventry, to "prayer-walk" every street of the city during this month of June. The idea is that when you go out for a walk along your street, you say a Rosary for the intentions of all the people on that street, that they will feel a part of God's Kingdom. You could do this on your own or with a member of your household. Between all the churches they hope to cover every street in Coventry. Maryvale Sacred Heart Novena. All are invited to join online for the Annual Novena to the Sacred Heart at the Shrine of the Sacred Heart at Maryvale Institute. There will be a Mass, Sermon and Novena live streamed each evening at 8pm from Thursday, 11th June to Friday, 19th June (Feast of the Sacred Heart). Archbishop Bernard Longley will be celebrating Mass on Sunday, 21st June, at 11am (on the day the 'physical' Pilgrimage would have taken place). It will be live streamed from St Chad's Cathedral.
