CHANGES TO THE PATTERN OF MASSES

In these changing and challenging times it is impossible to know beforehand the demand for public Masses and the total availability of stewards to make them possible.

Everything is under constant review, therefore, and a sustainable solid routine has yet to be discovered. After these two weeks we have found out several things. The demand for Mass is very much centred on Sunday and is increasing at the moment. Although we have a good number of stewards and cleaners their availability does not permit the number of weekday Masses we began with. Cleaning after every Mass is very demanding and time consuming. We will have to steward and clean after baptisms and funerals once they return in addition to any other Masses.

Therefore, we have no option but to reduce the number of public Masses. They will return once we can steward and clean after them, don't worry.

The first change: there will be **public Mass on Saturdays at 5pm** which will be a **Vigil Mass of the Sunday.** We have discovered that Mass at 11am would not leave time for the floor to dry safely after 9.00am

The second change: there will be no public Masses on Mondays or Fridays for the time being. Holidays have made this necessary.

Possible growth: would anyone volunteer to steward a *Friday 9.00am Mass from 21 August?* Thanks to the school this would **not involve cleaning:** the caretaker will kindly fog the church on Fridays. Contact Fr Stephen if you can help. I know this will disappoint some of you, and I apologise for that. But we can only do what's possible. The situation **will be kept under review.** We will also have to clean after baptisms and funerals as they occur too. Just as there is no obligation for anyone to be at Mass so there is no obligation for anyone to steward or clean. There is no right or wrong number of people in a congregation nor right or wrong number of stewards. **We must all do only what we feel safe doing, given our state of health.**

I thank all our stewards.

The Sunday Readings

SOLOMON, King in succession to his great father David, is offered anything he wants by God. He chooses not riches, nor fame, nor military might, but wisdom. For him, this is the greatest gift of all because in order to govern the Israelite people well, he seeks to know the difference between good and evil. All else follows from this gift of wisdom. "I don't know what to do for the best!" is what people say so often in so many difficult situations. Wisdom tells us exactly what to do for the best! In the Gospel, Jesus talks about the value of the Kingdom of God. Being part of that is worth more than anything else, for it contains all we'll ever need—not riches or fame but the true wisdom of knowing God face to face.

THE PARISH ART PROJECT

You can see the completed Holy Spirit banner made up of all your feathers hanging in the sanctuary. It's on the webcam and on the parish Facebook page in more detail. Thank you to Debbie and Annemarie, and all our feather makes for such a lovely creation.

GIVING ENVELOPES

Fr Stephen will be at the outside door by the MRR to hand out boxes of envelopes. He will be wearing gloves to do so, and be socially distanced behind a table and hopes that any queue forms 1.5m apart. You can also ask for a Mass or indeed anything else.

STEWARDS & CLEANERS

To be public, every Mass needs to be stewarded and the pews and floor area used in church need to be cleaned afterwards. We now have four teams for the Saturday night/Sunday. From 21 August we hope to add Friday 9am Mass to the weekly routine. Three volunteers so far—another three and that would be alternate weeks and with no cleaning afterwards—the school kindly fogs us. **THANK YOU!**

VOTIVE CANDLES

We have not yet found a way of safely allowing the lighting of votive candles. Issues of crowding, and repeated touching of items by different people make this a difficult challenge to meet. Hand sanitiser is flammable, so using that near flames is clearly unwise. If you wish to have a candle lit for you please speak to Fr Stephen or Dcn Leo

PUBLIC MASS RESUMES

Thanks to volunteer stewards & cleaners, we are able to be open for Mass

How wonderful to be back! This is most definitely **NOT** a return to normal, however welcome a return to Mass clearly is.

UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE AT EVERY MASS THESE RESTRICTIONS HAVE TO APPLY:

The Congregation MUST -

- ◆ Wear a covering over **nose and mouth** and stay 1.5m apart unless you are in the same household (**You should bring your own face covering:** you need it in the shops and many other places by law and we have very few).
- ◆ Sanitise hands on entry and exit
- ◆ Follow signs and follow the stewards' directions. We need to fill from the front to make it obvious when the church is full and to minimise cleaning.

During Mass there can be NO...

- ◆ Readers, servers, musicians nor Eucharistic ministers
- ◆ Children's liturgy nor Holy Water
- ◆ Collection bags nor Offertory procession
- ◆ Physical sign of peace
- ◆ Parish Missals, hymn books nor singing
- ◆ Votive candles used

At Holy Communion, PLEASE DO...

- ◆ Follow stewards' directions
- ◆ Queue in single file only, move forward not back
- ◆ Receive in silence, hands outstretched
- ◆ Step to the side, remove mask, consume, mask on

Please take no chances in coming IF...

- ◆ You have a serious health condition
- ◆ You feel ill
- ◆ You have a sick family member at home
- ◆ You have any cold or flu-like symptoms
- ◆ You think you have been exposed to Covid-19

Afterwards...

- ◆ Please leave as stewards direct you, no grouping
- ◆ The church has to be thoroughly cleaned

BAPTISMS

A simple baptism, with limited numbers present and all restrictions followed, is now possible, but only by arrangement.

WEDDINGS

It is possible to make tentative arrangements for weddings that are planned for 2021 or later. Current rules mean no more than 30 people may attend

CONFESSION

Confession is possible if socially distanced.

FUNERALS

It is now possible to hold a *small* funeral service or Mass in church, as long as all guidelines for the pandemic are complied with.

EMERGENCIES

Pastoral care in emergencies remains available: the sick and dying may still be anointed, babies in danger of death may still be baptised.
