First reading: Daniel 7: 9-10, 13-14 *His robe is white as snow.*

Psalm R. The Lord is king, most high above all the earth.

Gospel: Matthew 17: 1-9 *His face shone like the sun.*

First reading: Nahum 2:1-3; 3:1-3, 6-7 *Woe to the city soaked in blood.*

Psalm R. It is the Lord who deals death and life.

Gospel: Matthew 16: 24-28 *What has a man to offer in exchange for his life?*

✠ Saturday 8 August St. Dominic, Priest

First reading: Habakkuk 1:12-2:4 *The upright man will live by his faithfulness.*

Psalm R. You will never forsake those who seek you, O Lord.

Gospel: Matthew 17: 14-20 *If you had faith, nothing would be impossible for you.*

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

The Sunday obligation to attend Mass remains suspended by the Bishops. This means that for the time being there is **no obligation for people to attend Mass on Sunday**. If you can come to Mass on another day of the week, please do so. The capacity in church is reduced because of necessary social distancing. The ideal, safest scenario is for there to be a good spread of people coming to Mass across the seven days of the week. There will be a **daily Mass** at All Souls (times above).

Romans 8: 35,37-39

Earlier in this letter, Paul has shown that God saves us by unearned grace, out of pure love, without measuring our merits. Now he answers the implied question, "Why are we still suffering?"

Gospel

Matthew 14: 13-21

Disturbed by the death of John the Baptist, Jesus withdraws. Followers pursue him anyway. Jesus again exceeds the expectations of his close disciples. 'They all ate as much as they wanted.'

This will keep the driveway clear for traffic entering the site for church and nursery, and safe for people entering and exiting church. Please also observe the one-way system, exit past the nursery and on to Abercorn Road.

PEACE GARDEN Please feel free to make use of the Peace Garden around the back of church for private prayer. Seating and limited shelter is available. Social distancing required, of course.

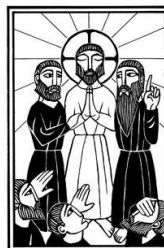
WEEKLY GIVING TO THE PARISH Thank you to all our parishioners who have been able to maintain their regular giving.

THE TRANSFIGURATION OF THE LORD Thursday 6 August



[On the Mountain of the Transfiguration] Jesus listens to the Law and the Prophets who spoke to him about his death and Resurrection. In his intimate dialogue with the Father, he did not depart from history, he did not flee the mission for which he came into the world, although he knew that to attain glory he would have to pass through the Cross. On the contrary, Christ enters more

deeply into this mission, adhering with all his being to the Father's will; he shows us that true prayer consists precisely in uniting our will with that of God. For a Christian, therefore, to pray is not to evade reality and the responsibilities it brings but rather, to fully assume them, trusting in the faithful and inexhaustible love of the Lord. *Pope Benedict XVI*

The Birmingham Diocesan Trust (BDT) is looking to appoint an experienced and qualified social worker or an alternatively qualified professional with significant multiagency safeguarding experience, to its Safeguarding Team.

As a Safeguarding Advisor you will, along with the Head of Safeguarding and other colleagues, be responsible for providing effective safeguarding advice and training across the Archdiocese of Birmingham.

You will be expected to promote excellent safeguarding practice, in line with local and national best practice, provide advice to Clergy and volunteer Parish Safeguarding Representatives on children and adults safeguarding practice and respond to safeguarding referrals.

You will need to be able to liaise effectively with a variety of statutory agencies and represent the Archdiocese at safeguarding meetings as well as supporting victims and survivors of past abuse.

This is a demanding and challenging role; therefore, we are looking for someone with:

- Experience of working within a safeguarding setting.
- A strong advocate for children at risk of harm and vulnerable adults and a determination to promote as paramount the safeguarding of children and vulnerable adults.
- Significant post qualification experience of adult or child safeguarding.
- Knowledge of both child and adult safeguarding legislation and guidance.
