NO MASK, NO ENTRY

From Saturday 25th July 2020 it became compulsory for all people in church to wear some sort of face covering. Face masks are no joy to wear, as I am sure you well know by now and given the choice we would prefer to be free of them. Nevertheless, their practical utility in protecting others and one's self from the virus has been attested by scientific and medical authorities. I am sure that you would agree with me that the public safety of others is a higher good than our own personal comfort.

There are of course people who will be exempt from wearing a face covering, these included children under the age of 11; people who cannot put on, wear or remove a face covering without experiencing "severe distress"; individuals with physical or mental disabilities who may have an issue with wearing a face coverings; people who communicate with others through lip-reading; and individuals with breathing conditions will not be required to follow the regulation.

To those individuals who are in the exempt category, by coming to Mass, by being in a public enclosed space you are putting yourself at risk and must accept full responsibility for your actions. If you have underlying health issues maybe for the time being you should remain safe, and stay at home.

To those individuals who are coming to Mass, please remember the following key points:

- ◆ The Church will have a separate entrance and exit, where possible.
- ◆ It is Compulsory to wear a face covering whilst visiting the church for Mass.
- ◆ Please sanitise your hands when entering and leaving the church.
- ◆ There will be no Mass/Hymn Books or Missalettes. Newsletters will be available, but must be taken home.
- ◆ Please leave a metre distance between each household or Common Households while seated. In Corpus Christi Church, one metre equals two chairs. In St. Anne's Church, there is a metre length red and white tape on every pew, please adjust the position of the red and white tape according to your number.
- ◆ Please do not touch the statues. Remember if you have touched something, so may have someone else. The least number of surfaces touched by people the better for yourselves.
- ◆ To request a Mass or Candle Intention(s) please go to the Sacristy to fill out an envelope or form, otherwise post your Intentions through the Presbytery door, during the week.
- ◆ There will be a one way system in place for Holy Communion. Please come forward for Holy Communion a row at a time, remembering to leave a metre distance between you and the person in front of you.
- ◆ There is no Holy Water at this time. Parishioners are welcome to bring in their bottles of water which Fr. David, will gladly bless.
- ◆ The Fr. Tuite Room, the Joachim Room will not be in operation. If you have to use the toilet, please be prepared to go back in the toilet after Mass to help clean them.
- ◆ Readers please sanitise their hands before touching the Lectionary.
- ◆ Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, please sanitise your hands **AFTER** you have received Holy Communion.

Thank you for your ongoing compliance with guidelines.

Compliance is the only way of ensuring we are safe and are seen to be safe, so protecting the vulnerable.

The Feast Day of Our Lady of the Snows 5th August and the Transfiguration 6th August

Both the events of these feast day celebrations occurred on a large landform rising above the surrounding land.

Our lady of the Snows Church, Santa Maria Majorie was built on one of the seven hills of Rome, the Esquiline. Devotion to Mary under the title of Our Lady of the Snows is one of the oldest devotions to Mary. According to tradition, a Roman Patrician, Giovanni and his wife, were childless and prayed to the Blessed Mother that she would designate an heir for them to bequeath their wealth. Our Lady indicated in a dream to childless couple that she wanted a church built in her honour and the site for this church would be covered with snow. This in the month of August! On a hot, sultry morning on August 5, 352A.D. the Esquiline Hill was covered with snow. All Rome proclaimed the summer snows a miracle, and a church to honour Our Lady was built on the hill in 358 A.D.

Since the 3rd century, some Christians have identified Mount Tabor as the site of the Transfiguration though none of the gospel accounts identify the "high mountain" of the scene by name. On the high mountain Jesus' body was Transfigured and became a brilliant white. Either side of him appeared Moses and Elijah. This epiphany was witnessed by Peter, James and John. St. Thomas Aquinas considered the transfiguration "the greatest miracle" in that it complemented baptism and showed the perfection of life in Heaven

In the scriptures, it is on mountains and hills where human nature meets God: the meeting place for the temporal and the eternal. In these feast days we are reminded that Our Lady is the Bridge builder; Jesus himself the bridge between heaven and earth.

Through Jesus and Mary we are called to rise above our sinfulness to the surrounding glory of the Kingdom of Heaven.
