

Church Offerings

Like all charities, the Church relies on the support of her members. Anyone who is involved with a charitable organisation at this moment in time will be well aware of the financial short falls they are experiencing due to the Coronavirus pandemic.

If we look at the parish of Corpus Christi as an example; just comparing the offertory gifts given from January to August 2019, to January to August 2020 we have a short fall of approximately £8,500. This does not include other income from the likes of the Lottery, Tea & Coffee mornings etc.

As a charity, the Church, like all Charities is not here to make a profit. We are here with a Mission. It is important however, that those who share the Church's Mission know how much their help is needed.

Some parishioners have been very kind and were continually giving through Standing Orders throughout the Lockdown period. Others who have envelopes continued to put aside their regular giving until such a time they were able to give in their Envelopes at Mass. And others without envelopes wrote cheques. Thank you for your support and generosity.

As Parishioners continue to return to Mass, and old familiar faces are reappearing, we are asking for your help and understanding while remaining sensitive to those whose financial circumstance may have changed.

While you weren't able to attend Mass due to the Lockdown, the Church bills; Gas, Electricity, Rates, Insurance, Salaries, etc... continued to come in. We are asking you therefore, if you are in a position to give what you have missed? If so, thank you!

It will be some time yet before we get back to normality. The year is not out and there is no guarantee that things will get better, but we hope and pray that they do.

Brass and General Cleaning

Stay Alert! Stay Safe!

To those individuals who are coming to Mass, please remember the following key points:

- ◆ Please sanitise your hands when entering and leaving the church.
- ◆ Please leave a metre distance between each household or Common Households while seated. In Corpus Christi Church, one metre equals two chairs. In St. Anne's Church, there is a metre length red and white tape on every pew, please adjust the position of the red and white tape according to your number.
- ◆ Please do not touch the statues. Remember if you have touched something, so may have someone else. The least number of surfaces touched by people the better for yourselves.
- ◆ There will be a one way system in place for Holy Communion. Please come forward for Holy Communion a row at a time, remembering to leave a metre distance between you and the person in front of you.
- ◆ If you have to use the toilet, please be prepared to go back in the toilet after Mass to help clean them.
- ◆ Readers please sanitise their hands before touching the Lectionary.
- ◆ Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, please sanitise your hands **AFTER** you have received Holy Communion.

Thank you for your ongoing compliance with guidelines.

Compliance is the only way of ensuring we are safe and are seen to be safe, so protecting the vulnerable.

Passport 2 Faith Cards

Due to the Coronavirus Pandemic the First Holy Communion Celebrations that should have taken place during the month of June 2020 never happened. These celebrations will take place later in the academic year depending upon preparations both in the schools and the parishes.

Many parishioners who had access to the Internet during the lockdown were following Mass from other parishes online. Many found this exercise usefully because it helped them to keep a regular prayer life. However, a virtual Mass can never replace the actual Mass, anymore than a virtual friend can replace the experience of a real physically present friend.

Public Mass has been celebrated in our parishes since the 4th July. Those who have been attending have found the churches to be both clean and safe and well organised, as much as any supermarket especially since the compulsory wearing of a face covering.

If your child is back in the classroom, then there is no reason why your child should not be attending Mass. Equally if there are adults out shopping, eating or drinking in a public circle, then they should be practising their faith.

It is important for our nation to get back to a regular and normal way of life, equally it is important for us to get back to a regular prayer life.

From next weekend the 5th /6th September those Children who were due to make their Communion in June 2020 and those children who are due to make their Communion and Confirmation in 2021 can collect their *Passport 2 faith* cards.
