### Attendees must...

### Holy Communion

- + Wait for stewards' directions

### Please stay at home if...

- + You have a pre-existing condition or are immuno-compromised
- + You are feeling ill
- + You suspect you may be ill or have been exposed to COVID-19
- + You have a sick family member at home

### Please note...

- + The obligation to attend Sunday Mass is suspended at this time
- + You are encouraged to come to Mass on other days of the week
- + Capacity in church is restricted
- + The church is cleaned after each liturgy (Mass, baptisms, funerals etc)
- + All parish meetings and events remain suspended for now

## IMPORTANT INFORMATION

The Sunday obligation to attend Mass remains **suspended** by the Bishops. This means that for the time being there is **no obligation for people to attend Mass on Sunday**. If you can come to Mass on another day of the week, please do so. The capacity in church is reduced because of social distancing. The ideal, safest scenario is for there to be a good spread of people coming to Mass across the seven days of the week. There will be a **daily Mass** at All Souls (times above).

### Celebrating, living and sharing God's word today



**First reading** Sirach 27:30-28:7  
Jesus ben Sirach was a sage living about 200 years before Jesus. His book tries to show the superiority of Jewish wisdom to both Jews and the pagans living among them.

**Second reading** Romans 14: 7-9  
In prior verses of this letter, Saint Paul asks the more mature members of his audience to behave a certain way toward the less mature. Now he gives his reason: not just because that would be right or kind, but because all belong to Christ.

**Gospel** Matthew 18:21-35  
Jesus gives one statement and one parable about forgiveness. There are surprising elements in each. *I tell you to forgive not seven times, but seventy-seven times.*

### NHS TRACK & TRACE

Each time you come to Mass please **bring with you a piece of paper with your name and phone number on**, and drop it into the locked metal box in the porch. Thank you.

- ❖ Only a **name** and **phone number** is needed.
- ❖ If a family come together, only one contact number is needed.
- ❖ Anyone is free to decline to provide details and still attend Mass.
- ❖ Details collected will be **stored securely** for 21 days.
- ❖ The legal basis on which the parish will hold this information is your consent.
- ❖ If NHS Track and Trace contacts the parish, details of those who attended the relevant Mass will be made available to them.
- ❖ After 21 days details collected will be **securely disposed of**.

**ADORATION** In the half hour before Mass each day the Blessed Sacrament will be exposed. This provides an opportunity for quiet prayer and adoration.

**FOOD BANK** Please place non-perishable items for the Food Bank in the box in the porch.

**ONE WAY TRAFFIC SYSTEM** The church site is very busy with church and nursery traffic, as well as pedestrians. Please follow the one way system ie enter from Kingsland Avenue and exit past the nursery and into Abercorn Road. Parking down the driveway at the side of church is only for those with mobility issues. Thank you for your cooperation for the sake of people's safety.

## KEEPING CONTACT DETAILS OF THOSE ATTENDING PUBLIC WORSHIP

### NHS TRACK AND TRACE

Government guidance for the safe use of places of worship states that churches should assist NHS Track and Trace by keeping a record of those who come to church. **From Monday 31 August 2020 we will be requesting contact details of people coming into church for public worship.**

#### General principles

- ❖ Only a **name** and **phone number** is needed.
- ❖ If a family come together, only one contact number is needed.
- ❖ Anyone is free to decline to provide details and still attend Mass.
- ❖ Details collected will be **stored securely** for 21 days.
- ❖ The legal basis on which the parish will hold this information is your consent.
- ❖ If NHS Track and Trace contacts the parish, details of those who attended the relevant Mass will be made available to them.
- ❖ After 21 days details collected will be **securely disposed of**.

#### Method of collecting information

When coming to Mass please bring a small piece of paper with your name and phone number on, which you will be invited to drop into a locked metal container in the porch.

Stewards will be on hand to assist.

#### Funerals, baptisms, weddings etc

Those attending funerals, baptisms, weddings etc will be asked to do the same.

I thank you for your co-operation with this further step to ensure everyone's safety.
