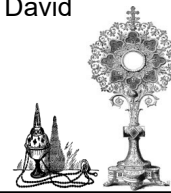

Christmas Masses 2020

Christmas may feel along way off at the moment but it will soon be here (*less than 10 weeks if you are interested*). From a health and safety point of view we need to start planning now for the Christmas Masses especially under the current climate.

In the past, we have had two Masses on Christmas Eve and one Mass on Christmas Day. In the past we never had to worry about numbers, and social distancing. This year however, we will have to have a different approach.

Fr. David's thoughts have been numerous. At this moment his thinking is to have one additional Mass on Christmas Eve. Mass times would therefore run something like: Christmas Eve, 5pm in Corpus Christi, 7pm in St. Anne's and 9pm in Corpus Christi. Christmas Day 10am in Corpus Christi.

We need to leave two hours in between Masses for the priest's health. Leaving a two hour gap between any other times would make Mass either too early or too late.

With that said, there will be conditions for these Masses. The first being that there are four Stewards at each Mass. If we don't have at least four Stewards volunteering several weeks before Christmas, then that Mass will not happen. It is no good volunteering the morning before. Fr. David will have to know who the stewards are no later than the first weekend in December. As we said, this needs to be planned well ahead.

Also Cleaners will be required to sanitise the Churches between Masses, no less than four cleaners. Again, we would like to know before hand who will be there at the end of November please.

The second condition. You will only be admitted to Mass if you are holding a valid Ticket/Pass. A number of tickets/passes will be issued towards the end of November for each Mass. Without a ticket or even the correct ticket you will not be able to come into church. So for example if you took a ticket for the 5pm Mass, and then you decided to come to the 9pm you would not be able to come in (*unless there was space*) to that Mass. Taking a ticket, and then not showing up, would prevent others attending. It would be equally wrong to take a ticket for every Mass because you are unable to decide which one you want to attend until the last minute or you want to attend all three masses thus preventing others attending (*unless you have a ministry*) It will also be helpful to know if any parishioner needs wheel chair/ walker frame reservation etc... (*Fr. David will be at all 3, if that's ok, lol*)

Please be mindful of coming to Mass on Christmas Eve early. Turning up for Mass a minute before Mass starts proves a nightmare for our wardens. We should all aim, at any Mass to be seated and comfortable five minutes before time.

We are aware that some churches will be doing a pre-booking service online or over the phone. Fr. David doesn't have the staff to accommodate this system. We cannot either just allow people to rock up to Mass in huge numbers due to social distancing etc.

The ticket/pass system seems a good idea, unless you have a better one; at least this way you know you will have a guaranteed seat. However, we cannot guarantee that you will be able to sit next to the person you may have come to Mass with if you turn up late or at the last minute.

It seems fair to give first refusal of Tickets/Passes for St. Anne's Church Christmas Eve Mass at 7pm for St. Anne's Parishioners i.e. those who attend the regular 9am Sunday morning Mass, as there is only one Mass for Christmas in their church.
