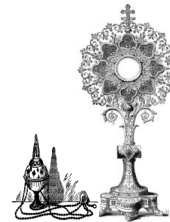

Father Hudson's Care : This weekend's Second Collection

Father Hudson's Care is the social care agency of the Catholic Archdiocese of Birmingham, an area stretching from Henley-on-Thames to Newcastle-under-Lyme, from Witney to Leek, and from Worcester to Rugby.

Our school and parish engagement officers provide outreach services to primary schools, secondary schools and church communities; our family support in schools service operates in Birmingham, Oxfordshire and Staffordshire; and we support community projects in a range of locations.

Father Hudson's Care provides for the following:

- Residential care for older people - Older people and those living with dementia find a home from home at St Joseph's, a residential community in Coleshill.
- Care and support for disabled people - People with disabilities, sensory impairments or learning difficulties are supported to live life to the fullest through our adult care services.
- Loving foster carers - Children and young people find a loving home through our New Routes fostering service, based near Birmingham in the West Midlands.
- Support after adoption or care - Adults affected by a childhood separation from their family of origin find support and answers through our Origins service.
- Support in the community - Vulnerable and disadvantaged people find a helping hand through our community projects, working with partners to meet local needs.

This weekend's Second Collection is in Aid of our Diocesan Charity. The money that you are able to give will enable the development of community projects, which rely entirely upon charitable donations. More than this, it demonstrates the Diocesan recognition of the work carried out in the name of the Church for the wider community.
