THE WEDDING GARMENT:

The gospel as well as the first reading have spoken to us about the Messianic banquet God has prepared for those who love him. What a wonderful promise we are given in the first reading! *God will wipe away all tears in our eyes and take away his peoples' shame everywhere on earth.* Christians like all good people, live in a hostile world. The we have today sometimes comes from our close friends, some of them members of our families who are absolutely not interested in God or with anything to do with God. Some of us might have heard people say, 'do not bring your Christian religion to my house! Anything to do with God or with the church is enough to ruin friendship.

Jesus is calling us today to enter into a heavenly communion with him. Whenever he says the kingdom of heaven is compare to a king, is compared to a householder, is compared to a landowner; 'King', 'Householder', 'Landowner' refer to God himself. The Father has called us to Jesus the Son at his heavenly banquet. Everything is ready come but as we know many people are not interested. God, Jesus Christ, salvation, the cross sound like invented myths.

The invited guests were not interested. How many opportunities does God give to his people and they are not interested! Oh I'm taking my children to play football, you see this is the only free time I have in a week to do my own things, I'm going to work, I wake up late. The excuses people make when God calls them to the Sunday Eucharist, might not be so different from the excuses that Jesus talks about in the gospel today. However people's refusal to come to God does not take away his invitation. When the invitation is declined God gives it to other people. Go to the streets and crossroads and bring in anyone you can find. Never let the opportunity given to you be passed to someone else! Take it, make use of it and make your life better by it.

What can we say about the man who was found without a wedding garment and what is that wedding garment? It is the state of grace, God's life within us. True we are blessed to have this earthly life but it is not enough we need God in our life. It is true we have earthly food but Jesus tells us to work for the bread that gives us eternal life. The wedding garment, God's life in us, cannot be exchanged or replaced by something else other than God. **We** are not here by chance; **God** put **us** here. If we take care of that garment, God's very life in us, we shall not be turned away. There is no short cut to God, there is only ne way and that is Jesus Christ.

As you return home, I ask you to take back with you the message from the first reading. In your trials and tears remember that promise: "the Lord will remove the mourning veil covering all peoples and the shroud enwrapping all nations. He will destroy death forever. The Lord will wipe away the tears from every cheek, he will take away his people's shame everywhere on earth for the Lord has said so"

Go home and think about your baptism, it made you a child of God and a member of the church, it gave you the promise of eternal life. What other dignity is greater than that? Let us move forward with our wedding garments on as we wait for the final invitation to the Lord's heavenly banquet.

YOU ARE MOST WELCOME to our Parish Church. If it is your first time here or probably you have been here before, your presence with us at this moment at our community worship is greatly appreciated. Our Parish Church is the second to be built in Coventry after the Protestant Reformation. It was built in 1893, the pews have never moved since then! World Mission Sunday: Next Sunday we celebrate Mission Sunday- World Mission Sunday is vital to the growth of the Church and the spread of the Gospel in predominately impoverished and remote areas overseas. The support from Missio transforms lives and creates a hub from which the young Church can flourish and grow. World Mission Sunday is one of only three Papal collections and has been especially chosen by the Holy Father to support the mission of the Church in the world.

First Holy Communion for children of the parish who attend school in non catholic schools will take place on two different dates. Polish children will receive their FHC on Saturday 17th of October at 10.00am & children from non-Catholic schools will receive on 24th Oct at 9.30am Mass. Parents please keep time as this day going to be a memorable day in the lives of your children.

Diocesan levies increased: The Archdiocese has increased the levy to be taken from St. Mary and Benedict parish by 48%. Levy are charged on the Sunday collection offered by the parishioners. In 2020 the parish paid £13,697.74, in the coming tax year 2021 the parish will be charged £20, 295.08.

Why is receiving the host at Mass called “Communion”? Catholics used the term communion when speaking about the action of receiving the Eucharistic host at Mass. But, the word is used so frequently that the real meaning is sometimes forgotten. Communion is the union with God when we receive the body, blood, soul and divinity of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. The entire Mass is directed toward this primary goal of uniting us with God. To receive communion is to be united with God in a mysterious way that is difficult for us to fully understand in this life. Children of the parish and from the school are having their First Holy Communion during this time, please remember to pray for them.
