## THE SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT



Blessed are you, sovereign Lord, just and true: to you be praise and glory for ever. Of old you spoke by the mouth of your prophets, but in our days you speak through your Son, whom you have appointed the heir of all things. Grant us, your people, to walk in his light, that we may be found ready and watching when he comes again in glory and judgment; for you are our light and our salvation. **R./ Blessed be God for ever.**

### THE GOD WHO SPEAKS: CELEBRATING, LIVING & SHARING GOD'S WORD

#### The Book of Exodus: God rescues his people from slavery

The name 'Exodus' comes from the Greek language and means a **going out**, a marching out or a solemn procession. The Book of Exodus narrates how Moses led the Israelites out of slavery in Egypt and how he led them in building the Tabernacle with God's instructions.

#### A quotation from Exodus

God said, "I am the Lord your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery; you shall have no other gods before me" (Exodus 20:2-3).

#### A crucial event

The events narrated in Exodus and the following books are of crucial importance for Israel's faith memory. Without the event of the Exodus there would never have been a people called Israel.

In the book of Genesis we were told the story of Abraham and his family, but soon their descendants will be formed into one nation and one people. Their liberation from slavery in Egypt and the giving of the Covenant at Mount Sinai made these people into a nation united in faith around its God, who will repeat again and again "You are my people and I am your God" (Exodus 6:7).

#### God leads his people out of slavery into service

Everything else in the Old Testament can only be properly understood against the background of the Exodus. Through the Exodus, Israel came to understand that its God was, unlike other gods, someone interested in their history. The other gods of the neighbouring peoples were only gods of nature, to be invoked to obtain a good harvest and to have good fertility; but Israel's God was also and above all a God of History, directly leading his people and intervening on their behalf.

#### The Passover

Even today, the Jewish people recall and make present the Exodus as they celebrate the Passover. When Jewish people celebrate it in worship, they participate in the experience and enter into it with deep meaning. God frees them from anything that enslaves them. This allows them to understand that the whole of life is seen as an exodus, a journey towards the Kingdom of God, and it makes it possible for them to have hope.

**God speaks to us** The message of Exodus is that God wants to free us from whatever enslaves us into the ways of faith and service. He has done this definitively through the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Listen out for lots of readings from the Book of Exodus in Lent and at Easter.

Requests for places are steadily coming in, especially for the 4.30pm Mass on Christmas Eve, so please make your arrangements sooner rather than later.

**ADVENT READINGS & CAROLS** Thank you for your lovely feedback about last Sunday's Advent Service of Lessons and Carols. The service is still available to watch on our Youtube channel.

**ADVENT & CHRISTMAS WALK WITH ME** booklets and calendars are available at the back of church. Please consider delivering one safely to anybody who is unable to get to church.

**ADVENT MUSIC** Once the "sounds of Christmas" start ringing in our ears and repeating again and again in our head, it is difficult to stay in the Advent moment. There are links on our website to some beautiful sacred Advent music to help us hold on to the spirit of Advent. The perfect accompaniment to some quiet prayer and reflection.

**CHRISTMAS CONFESSIONS** While a certain supermarket might have declared that there is no naughty list this year, the Sacrament of Confession will be readily available before Christmas for those who look forward to the Coming of One even greater than the big man from the North Pole! Saturday 19 10.30-11.30am; Monday 21<sup>st</sup> 10.15-11.00am; Tuesday 22<sup>nd</sup> 10.15-11.00am; Wednesday 23<sup>rd</sup> 10.15-11.00am; Thursday 24<sup>th</sup> 10.15-11.00am and at other times by arrangement.

**CHRISTMAS SERVICE OF NINE LESSONS & CAROLS** In a similar vein, Fr Paul will lead a Service of Christmas Lessons and Carols at 4pm on Sunday 27 December. In the busyness of Christmas why not set aside an hour to listen to the Good News of God-with-us proclaimed in scripture and to sing some carols.

**CHRISTMAS EVE CRIB SERVICE** Please note that this service at 3pm on Christmas Eve is a **livestreamed service only** (ie not in church). It is not a Mass, but a simple service of prayers and carols for families to watch either live or at another time over Christmas.

**MASS INTENTIONS FOR 2021** It is now possible to request Masses for 2021. You can use the envelopes in church and post through the presbytery door or make a request via the website.

**MONTHLY NATIONAL DAY OF PRAYER & FASTING FOR LIFE** On Monday 7 December, the Vigil of the Immaculate Conception, we're invited to join with other Catholics in prayer and fasting for an end to abortion and euthanasia. Included in our prayer are those agonising with decisions between life and death.

**POOR PARISHES FUND** At All Masses this week there will be a second collection for the Poor Parishes of the Diocese. your smartphone and **scan the All Souls QR code** on the posters in the porch OR Bring a **piece of paper with your name and contact number** and post it in the metal box in the porch.

**RETURNING TO MASS** The Sunday obligation remains suspended by our bishops, but if your own circumstances - including health and vulnerability to the virus - allow, please re-establish the discipline of weekly public worship. Livestreams and Acts of Spiritual Communion are intended to serve those who really need them; they are not proposed as substitutes or as a "new normal" for the majority.

## REMAINING VIGILANT

It is very important that we don't forget the basics of staying safe in church over the winter. Please make sure you:

**Sanitise your hands** on entry and exit (there are two automatic dispensers in the entrance porch and two in the exit porch).

**Wear a face covering** which covers both your mouth and nose.

**Maintain physical distancing** in and around the building.

From 2 December Government guidance on the safe use of places of worship insists that, "*In areas subject to Tier 2 and Tier 3 restrictions you must not meet (or mingle) with friends and family indoors in any setting, including a place of worship, unless they are part of your household or support bubble. In Tier 3 you must also not meet with people outside of your household or support bubble in a private garden or in most outdoor public venues.*"

## Information for parishioners

### A difficult year

This has been a very difficult year indeed because of COVID-19. Some of you will have lost loved ones to the virus; some of you will have had the virus yourselves; others will be facing an uncertain financial future. It is tempting to write off 2020 as an *annus horribilis*, but we know that as Christians we are called to have hope, to acknowledge that God is never absent from us and to believe that he works through the events of human history – even a global pandemic – for good and to establish his perfect kingdom. I would suggest, then, that rather than write 2020 off, we stay alert to what God is saying to us in and through this crisis. What unforeseen good might God bring out of this mess for me, my family, my parish, the Church, the world? What if in this moment God is inviting me to...? He is surely inviting all of us to greater trust in him and dependence on his goodness and mercy.

### Churches open for Christmas

Thank God that we are able to gather in church at Christmas to celebrate the Birth of Christ. I look forward to seeing you if your health and circumstances permit. For those unable to attend Mass in person, services will be livestreamed and our prayers will be with you. The livestream is primarily intended for those who really can not be physically present at Mass. Please do not be tempted to use it as a substitute for being at Mass now that public worship is possible again.

### Christmas will be different

It goes without saying that things will not be normal this year. Government restrictions remain in place to keep everyone safe. If you come to church you will need to wear a mask and will have to adhere to track and trace requirements. There will be no congregational singing of carols etc. There will be clear instructions about receiving Holy Communion and returning to your place. The number of people able to attend each Mass will be limited. Because of this last restriction parishes are circulating information about Christmas Mass times early.

### Planning ahead

Parishes in Coventry will all have some form of 'booking' system over Christmas so that we are not in the position of having over-crowded churches. So please plan ahead now. You are asked please to attend Mass in your own parish (where you live or where you normally worship) and to familiarise yourself with the Christmas Mass times and arrangements. The obligation to attend Mass on Christmas Day itself (or the evening before) does not apply this year. You might therefore consider making one of the days of the Christmas Octave (Christmas week) your 'Christmas Day'. Understandably many people *will* want to be in church on Christmas Day itself or the evening before, so here's the plan at All Souls!



N.B. Wherever interaction can take place, social distancing of 1m+ should still be strictly maintained between anyone who doesn't live together or are in a 'support bubble'

**Baptisms** fall into the government category of 'life-cycle ceremonies'. For baptism outside of Mass 6 people are permitted to attend. At baptisms during a regular parish Mass as many people as the building can safely accommodate are permitted, though we will be asking families to limit the baptism group to 30 people, including child, parents and godparents.
