◆ STEWARDS & CLEANERS NEEDED FOR 5PM MASS ◆

At the moment, we are not able to steward the 5pm Mass with certainty over the next few Sundays. This means that we cannot be open for evening Mass without more volunteers. **Please speak to one of the clergy or email the parish to volunteer.** No one should volunteer who is not in good health or who is taking care of a vulnerable person. Numbers in the congregation at the 5pm Mass have recently reduced considerably and so it may be that we simply have a smaller pool to ask at present. Given the news about the virus, we cannot take any risks including simply assuming Masses will be adequately stewarded and will be 'all right on the night'. We need reserves to call on in case of sickness or needing to isolate. As Christians, we have a duty of care towards one another and to wider society. We look forward to being able to offer this Mass again as soon as volunteers have come forward. So, to be clear, as well as no 5pm today (which was announced last week), there will be **no 5pm Mass next Sunday 10 January**. If enough volunteers come forward this week, it can return after that.

We begin a new year in difficult circumstances. May 2021 be the year we finally beat the pandemic, but we have some time to go... Fr Stephen, Fr Peter & Deacon David wish you and your families every blessing for 2021.

FR STEPHEN WRITES: 2021 begins in the middle of a worsening pandemic and yet with the vaccination starting to be used. It looks set to be the year we overcome Covid-19 but we are certainly not there yet and don't know when we will be. Everyone has been affected by lockdowns, and by restrictions on movement, education, and trade if not by the virus itself. The Church and its parishes are no exception. For ten months and with more to come we have operated under great limitations: so much has changed. So, when this does end – as it will – what will we find? We cannot yet be sure, but it is likely to be quite different to how it all was before such a lengthy interruption to normality. On a practical level we shall have work to do to restore our churches and halls to safe and full use. On a spiritual level we shall need to nurture what have become more scattered communities, rediscover how best weekly patterns of worship, meetings and devotions serve people's needs, meet one another afresh and find again the joys of proper, unfettered community life. The clergy will finally be able to sit down and have a cup of tea with you! There is but a fine line between a challenge and an opportunity, and so going forward with Jesus, Emmanuel, 'God-is-with-us' may we go into the new year allowing Him to lead us, open to what might be new and different. But above all to what allows us to serve Him and His people as He wills. May Our Lady's and St Joseph's prayers help us grasp what 2021 will bring to help us grow in love and knowledge of God. May God bless us all in this new year.

FR PETER REFLECTS: The day we entered Tier Four the artwork spray-painted on the shutter of a closed shop suddenly caught my eye. It boldly proclaimed: "After the storm comes the Rainbow". This gift of nature is a major sign in the Bible of God's compassion. The mural is a monument perpetually thanking all of the NHS doctors, nurses, carers and other key workers, to whom we owe a huge on-going debt of gratitude, as the pandemic enters this crucial phase. By celebrating the Feast of Epiphany, let us bring the light of Hope and Love to those around us as we build, whenever and wherever we can, a 'culture of encouragement'. May the words of our local Saint, John Henry Newman, herald a fresh dawn in 2021 – as we take up his challenge: "Let us throw our hearts into all we think, say, and do; and may it be a spiritual heart. This is to be a new creature in Christ; this is to walk by faith." (*Parochial and Plain Sermons* V, 12).

COVENTRY IS NOW IN TIER 4 of the pandemic restrictions. The Government regulations state '**You can attend places of worship for a service. However, you must not mingle with anyone outside your household or your support bubble. You should maintain strict social distancing at all times**'. We shall remain open unless told otherwise but **we must still follow all the pandemic guidelines.**

PUBLIC WORSHIP: *We thank the volunteer cleaners and stewards* without whom we would not be here together. Public worship is totally dependent on their efforts.

HANDS – please remember to sanitise your hands and to touch as little as possible. Please take away the news sheet on your seat so that no one else touches it.

FACE – wear a face covering over mouth and nose. If cannot do this, you must keep 2 metres or 6 feet distance.

SPACE – keep more than 1 metre (or 3 feet) away from people not in your household. Please do not move the seats unless to move closer to a family member. **Seats must not be moved for any other reason and must always be 1 metre from the aisle and the point of Communion, and anyone else** behind, beside or in front of you if not in your household. (If you do not wear a mask, your seat must be 2 metres distant). When you move for Communion, or to enter or leave the church, remember that the shortest route may always not be the safest – always keep 1 metre distance (2 metre if no mask). Stewards will guide you.

VENTILATION – We must keep fresh air coming in to minimise the risk of viruses in stale air.

Please follow instructions from stewards – they are there to help make sure that these guidelines are followed.

The good news about vaccines mean that we move ever closer to the end of all this – but it isn't over yet.

BAPTISMS AND WEDDINGS: Pandemic guidelines apply. No more than **6 people may be at a baptism** and **no more than 15 at a wedding.**

FUNERALS: These may still happen in church under the restrictions that apply to all public Masses with **no more than 30 people** present: stewards and cleaners needed.

CONFESSION: May be celebrated outdoors in a public space maintaining social distancing. Please ask the priests.

EMERGENCY PASTORAL CARE: This remains available of course, under the guidance given for the safety of all involved – carers, relatives, priest, **and** the person receiving the sacraments in an emergency.
