**FR STEPHEN WRITES:** The appearance of anything diseased on the skin was, in Biblical times, a cause of great fear. It might be leprosy! Not only would that mean eventual disfigurement and death, but it also meant total exclusion from the rest of society. A very disabling disease and a very lonely existence for the victim. Any skin disease tends, of course, to be a very noticeable illness in a way that many diseases aren't. It becomes easy to treat the sufferers differently for they are literally marked out by their condition. So Jesus, always seeking the outcasts as He was, has pity on the leper in today's Gospel reading. He cures the man who is set free not only of physical suffering but the mental anguish of exclusion from society. Sin disfigures the soul, but of course we cannot see that. How terrible it would be if our sins left a tell-tale mark on our skins! But how wonderful that Jesus wants to cure us of that and bring us back from exclusion from God. We may well have no leprosy, but Jesus cures us of our sins just as surely. Lent, as Fr Peter reminds us, is a time when through renewed prayer, fasting, almsgiving and penitence we challenge ourselves anew to experience just what the Risen Christ, the 'Sun of righteousness' can do for us, as the prophet Malachi foretold and as we sing at Christmas – 'risen with healing in His wings'.

**FR PETER REFLECTS:** St Paul christens us as athletes for Jesus (1 Cor 9, 24-27). During the 40 days of Lent, we are in spiritual circuit training. To join St Peter, on his Easter morning breathless run. He's investigating the story of the empty tomb, told by the two Marys, Mary Magdalene and Mary the Mother of James and Salome. St Peter has an unnamed companion with him, so we can imagine that person as one of us. The disciples sped on that daylight-breaking dash, with a mixture of bewilderment and confusion at Christ's passion and death. They returned in haste, full of risen-inspired joy. We run with this certainty about Christ in our hearts. Arriving first, ahead of an out-of-condition fisherman. Pausing at the sepulchre's opening, we contemplate the meaning of the scene. Typically, Peter doesn't hesitate. He bursts past, handing the baton of Faith, Hope and Love to us. We race in relay for our time, sharing the eternal flame of Jesus, in the Olympics of new life.

**ASH WEDNESDAY 2021 Mass at 10.00am** Ashes will be given at the very end of Mass. After the dismissal you will be invited to come forward just as you do for Communion, ash will be sprinkled on your head (touching is forbidden during the pandemic for obvious reasons - there can be no ash crosses put on foreheads therefore). You then leave the church directly.

There will also be a public Mass with ashing in the same way

at **St Thomas More at 6.30pm**

The liturgies of Holy Week and Easter will be modified too: we await instructions for those. There will certainly be no foot washing anywhere!

**ALWAYS REMEMBER THE BASIC COVID RULES**  
**HANDS** –sanitise, **FACE** – wear a face covering over mouth *and* nose, **SPACE** – stay 2 metres (or 6 feet) away from people not in your household. Please do not move the seats unless to move closer to a family member. **Seats must always be AT LEAST 2 metres from the aisle and the point of Communion and anyone else.**  
**VENTILATION** – We must keep fresh air coming in. Please follow instructions from stewards – they are there to help make sure that these guidelines are followed.
