MORE VOLUNTEERS? WEEKDAY MASS..? HOLY WEEK..?

As you know, we **cannot** open the church for worship **without at least three stewards and cleaners** on duty to make sure that the Covid regulations are met and the church is disinfected afterwards. We are all keen, of course, that the church should be open as much as possible. But it is only our volunteers that make it possible! So the opening of the church is not just about what we'd like but who can volunteer. Why at least three? One always on the door (preferably two), and two to seat people safely distanced. We are not allowed to take chances! Masks, sanitiser, track & trace and 2 metre distance are rules we must keep no matter who or how many people turn up, whatever we open for. If you feel able to help to help bring back 10am Thursday Mass or 1230pm Sunday Mass or 5pm Sunday Mass or support Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday or any combination, **please say so**. Contact us by email or speak to one of the clergy indicating when you can help. No one must feel obliged to do anything they aren't comfortable with: at the moment many people are still not comfortable coming to Mass. That's entirely understandable, the decision is up to each individual. Thank you to current volunteers and some new ones. Your help is indispensable if we are to be open. We **ALL** have a Christian duty to keep everyone in church **and** in wider society as safe as possible. What happens publicly in church is determined by the number and availability of volunteers.

ALWAYS REMEMBER THE BASIC COVID RULES HANDS – sanitise, FACE – wear a face covering over mouth and nose, SPACE – stay 2 metres (or 6 feet) away from people not in your household. Please do not move the seats unless to move closer to a family member. **Seats must always be AT LEAST 2 metres from the aisle and the point of Communion and anyone else.**
VENTILATION – We must keep fresh air coming in. Please follow instructions from stewards – they are there to help make sure that these guidelines are followed.

FR STEPHEN WRITES The ancient Israelites had many opportunities to draw close to God. The Law, the prophets and the consecration of the Temple had all been God's gift to them as a revelation of who He is. But the stubborn still ignored Him, and went their own way of sinfulness and idolatry. So He sends His only Son to call his people back to Him. Jesus is, of course, God's ultimate revelation of Himself. By coming among us as one of us, He gets as close to us as is possible. And Jesus brings the message of salvation. To look upon Him, to know Him brings healing. Just as the dreadful snakebites in the desert were cured by the sight of a bronze serpent lifted up for all to see, so the dreadful curse of death will be cured by the raising up of Christ on the Cross.

FR PETER REFLECTS: St John Henry Newman wrote a Triduo to St Joseph in thanksgiving for his feast: First Day: May we be made worthy to receive St Joseph, husband of Mary, for our intercessor in heaven, whom on earth we venerate as our holy Protector: who livest and reignest world without end. Amen. Second Day: His was the title of Father of the Son of God, because he was the Spouse of Mary, ever Virgin. He was our Lord's father, because to him were entrusted, and by him were faithfully fulfilled, the duties of a father, in protecting Him, giving Him a home, sustaining and rearing Him, and providing Him with a trade. Day Three: He is Holy Joseph, because no other Saint but he lived in such and so long intimacy and familiarity with the source of all holiness, Jesus, God incarnate, and Mary, the holiest of creatures.
