ARE YOU A SHEPHERD OR A HIRED MAN?

For the years the people of Israel spent in Egypt, they seem to have engaged in mixed farming. The book of Numbers 11:5, tells us how they recalled enjoying pots of meat, fish, leeks melons and cucumbers in Egypt. When they entered desert life, they lost crop agriculture and became animal keepers. In the desert, it was easy to lose your animals to wild beasts, to marauding thieves, or to your neighbours because of mix-up. Therefore it was important that the shepherd knew his sheep and that the sheep knew their shepherd's voice when he called them one by one. Above all the shepherd had the willingness to lay down his life in defence of his sheep. These qualities lacked in the hired man, he would certainly not be willing to lose his life defending sheep that did not belong to him. He would not know the names of every sheep and the sheep would not know his voice. Thus such sheep would be in constant danger.

Today is Good Shepherd Sunday. Apart from Jesus letting us know who he is to each one of us, he is also telling us what we ought to be to others. I'm the Good Shepherd to you, I'm not a hired man to take care of you. You belong to me, I know you by name and I lay down my life for you. These are powerful statements.



All of us are shepherds of God's people and we are sheep of his flock. We need to ask ourselves: What kind of shepherd am I? and what kind of sheep am I in God's flock? To be a shepherd implies responsibility. Are you a husband or a wife? Are you parents to these children? Then you are shepherds - so what kind of shepherd are you to your wife, to your husband, to your children, to your family? As a priest and above all as a Parish priest, I must ask myself every day, what kind of shepherd am I to my people?

Some priests and pastors have ceased to be good shepherds and behave like hired men in the church. Some married men and women behave like thieves and brigands abandoning their children to be attacked by wolves and torn apart. Children – (sheep) do not know who to turn to, either to dad, or to step dad or to step, step dad! Some children do not know who is their real mother, is it dad's girlfriend or dad's partner. What a sad world we are living in? Many of us will not go to heaven because of neglecting our duties, behaving like hired men, thieves and brigands while occupying positions of trust.

In the first reading St. Peter has given us the name of him who tells us that he is the Good Shepherd: Jesus, the key stone rejected by the builders, the only name by which we can be saved. As you return home today, thank God that through Jesus Christ, he knows you by name and that he has given up his life for your sake.

Go home fully aware that you are a shepherd, God has placed people in your life to take care of. Go and behave like a true shepherd not like a hired man. But above all in your dealings ask yourself: "According to the way how I'm behaving what kind of shepherd would I take myself to be? Am I behaving as a Good Shepherd or am I acting as a hired man?
