#### **WHO'S WHO AMONG THE PARISH CLERGY..?**

**Fr Stephen** - the tall one, with combed back hair and round glasses – is parish priest here and parish priest of St Thomas More

**FR STEPHEN WRITES:** The great philosopher St Augustine said, "If you can fathom it, you can be sure it is not God". In other words, it is impossible for finite human minds to understand the infinity of might, majesty and glory that is God. We can know only what God reveals to us about Himself and what our minds can grasp. Moses reminds the people about the wonders done by God so that they might be saved from slavery and oppression in Egypt. Keep His laws, he says, so that you may prosper and live long. Of course, in Jesus God reveals Himself most fully. In today's Gospel Jesus speaks plainly about the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. He gives the disciples the commission to make disciples and to baptise them in the threefold Name. And the hallmark of true discipleship, true conversion is the keeping of God's commands. By this, we maintain our true relationship with the infinite God: the One who makes us His sons and daughters and delights to have us call Him Father. For at the heart of God Himself is a relationship, a relationship of the love between Father, Son and Holy Spirit. It is that that God calls us to enjoy, rejoice in and be part of!

**FR PETER REFLECTS** on *Let us Dream*: Pope Francis concludes his provocative, Gospel-inspired, manifesto with these words: 'By making the integration of the poor and the care for our environment central to society's goals, we can generate work while humanizing our surroundings. By providing a universal basic income, we can free and enable people to work for the community in a dignified way. By adopting more intensive permaculture methods for growing food, we can regenerate the natural world, create work and biodiversity, and live better. All this means having common-good goals for human development rather than the false assumptions of the infamous trickle-down theory that a growing economy will make us all richer. By focusing on land, lodging, and labour we can regain healthy relationships with the world and grow by serving others. Democracy is then invigorated by the concerns and wisdom of the people who are involved in it. Politics can once again be an expression of love through service. By making the restoration of our peoples' dignity the objective of the post-Covid world, we make everyone's dignity key to our actions. To guarantee a world where dignity is valued and respected through concrete actions is not just a dream but a path to a better future.' (p.132-33).

**ALWAYS REMEMBER THE BASIC COVID RULES**  
**HANDS** – sanitise, **FACE** – wear a face covering over mouth *and* nose, **SPACE** – stay **AT LEAST 1 metre (or 3 feet)** away from people not in your household. *Seats must always be 1.5 metres from the aisle and the point of Communion and anyone else not in your household.*
