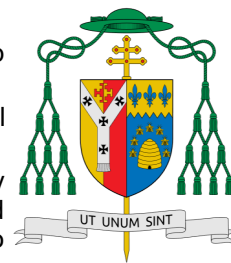

The task is too much for anyone person, parish priest or lay member. But as a community we can make sure that they know they are missed and still deeply in our prayers.

In the past an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion would have gone out to the individual's home, or Care Home. Due to Covid-19 that has not been possible. Now that restrictions are easing, and a good number of people have been vaccinated it is time to set things back in motion.

Those who are Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, can you please make known to Fr. David that you are willing to take Holy Communion to the Sick and Housebound at this time.

Equally, those who are sick and Housebound need to make it known that they would be happy to receive an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion into their home during this time. We will have to prioritise those concerned. If you can't get to Mass, but you can go shopping, go to the hair salon or go and meet your friends and family for afternoon tea. then sadly you won't be at the top of the list. Until the Blessed Sacrament is available on Amazon or click and collect the church has limited manpower and needs to position it where it is genuinely needed. *(the amazon comment was a joke by the way, LOL)*

Prayers unanswered

There was a lovely article on the website called America, the Jesuit Review the other day. The article was Pope Francis' response as to why it seems that when we pray, God does not answer our prayers.

Prayer is not a magic wand: it is a dialogue with the Lord. We can run the risk of changing our relationship with God into something magical rather than an authentic experience of faith. We can easily run into the risk of not being the one to serve God, but rather we expect God to serve us! We want God to direct events according to our own design rather than to the Will of God, who knows what is best for us. Even if our prayer is sincere the waiting for a prayer to be answered is like the dark night of the soul. Yet Christ comes to us as the flame of faith to guide us and asks us to be humble and patient on the Lord's good grace.

The Hour will conclude with Benediction around 4.40pm.

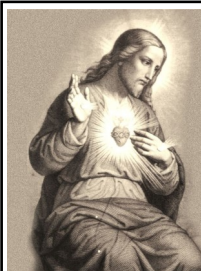
You are welcome to come for the whole hour or just call in and spend a little quiet time with the Blessed Sacrament.



The Feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus

This Friday, 11th June is the Feast of The Sacred Heart of Jesus.

Once upon a time, it would have been very difficult to find a Catholic home without an image of the Sacred Heart .



In 1673, a French nun named Margaret Mary Alacoque had a private revelation of Jesus, in which he asked the Church to honour his Most Sacred Heart. In particular, Jesus gave to St. Margaret Mary 12 specific promises made to all who venerated and promoted devotion to the Sacred Heart. The ninth promise is;

I will bless every place in which an image of my heart is exposed and honoured.

May we always have a true devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus; may our hearts find rest in his Divine Heart.
