COVID LATEST: RESTRICTIONS NOW

The Bishops write -

It is important to reiterate that... the general principles of continuing to create a safe environment in places of worship and their ancillary buildings are not abandoned.

It is therefore strongly recommended by the Bishops (listening to healthcare professionals and the Government) that **we continue to -**

- **Use face coverings**
- **Use hand sanitiser**
- **Ventilate the church building**
- **Use Track & Trace and stay distant**
- **Clean the church after weekend Masses**
- **Keep the existing unused pews to help with social distancing and cleaning** (Of course, if congregations get bigger, this will be reconsidered)

There is, therefore, very little that we should be changing in our routines to minimise Covid risk. Relaxing rules may be *legal* but not necessarily *safe* or *moral*. All of us would love to give up on Covid and the restrictions, but that is simply not sensible yet. All of us still have a duty to consider the health of others.

The Bishops furthermore recommend that changes to routines are made slowly—getting back to normal is a *process* and *not* a sudden event.

PLEASE COMPLETE THE PARISH QUESTIONNAIRE IF YOU CAN HELP

To help with establishing what is possible and when, a questionnaire has been circulated asking if people would soon like to resume the roles they had, take on something new or if they'd like to wait a bit. We start by circulating this in church because, obviously, those of you who come to Mass are prepared to be out and about, mixing with people. Thank you to those who have completed one: there have been very many positive and helpful comments and suggestions.

No one should feel any pressure whatever to make a commitment to doing something they'd rather not. Not every event or group is included on the questionnaire—for example, children's liturgy; this doesn't meet over the summer anyway, we don't have many children attending at present and so can be considered after the summer holidays.

THANK YOU TO ALL OUR VOLUNTEER STEWARDS AND CLEANERS. Cleaning and stewarding have to continue. Please *don't forget* that they have kept us open! *Please volunteer to join the team if you can.* We'd hoped this could stop, but it's been a truly great example of parish commitment and of giving a warm welcome

The Sunday Readings IN TODAY'S GOSPEL, Jesus

It makes a great promise to us. The crowds have seen the great miracle of Jesus feeding the them with just a few loaves and fishes. They want to see more, but can not begin to guess how much more Jesus has to give them. They want to know how to work for God, and Jesus tells them to do that is to believe in Him whom He has sent. So, they wonder, what sign will Jesus give to show that he is the one they should believe in. God provided a miraculous food for the Israelites as they journeyed through the desert, the manna that kept them fed for as long as they needed. That was a sign to be believed in. So Jesus promises yet more, that He Himself is the Bread of Life, that He is all the food we need to travel not though the desert to the promised land of Canaan, but through life itself into the glory of heaven. Whatever Jesus did with the loaves and fishes is pretty small beer compared to that!

THE CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS & CURRENT GUIDELINES

Everything that happens in church should still be done carefully to minimise risk. Everyone who enters is asked **sanitise hands, wear a face covering and respect distance. Track & Trace details should be given** or the NHS smartphone app used

BAPTISMS

Baptism may be celebrated, please with precautions above. Please see one of the clergy after a weekend Mass.

WEDDINGS

Weddings may be celebrated with the conditions described above. Please make an appointment with Fr Stephen: six months notice is best.

CONFESSION

It is available before 5pm Mass but always also by appointment if you'd prefer.

FUNERALS

Funerals may be celebrated, but please with the precautions above.
