## Twenty-Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time Year B

Readings: Isaiah 50:5-9; Ps. 114; James 2:14-18; Mark. 8:27-35

### Christian's Identity

At the very end of Peter Weir's film about World War 1, Gallipoli, Frank Dunne (played by Mel Gibson) is racing back to a frontline trench with the news that the attack has been called off. Meanwhile, Major Barton is commanded to "order the men over." In doing so he is sending them to certain death. In the sense that follow each man prepares for his final moment on earth. Some write notes to their families, some weep at the futility of the entire exercise, some have a cigarette, and one recites the twenty-third Psalm, other on rosary. Just as they prepare to attack, Barton offers these words of encouragement: "**All right, men, we are going. I want you all to remember who you are, you are from the Tenth Light horse Brigade. Don't forget it! Good luck.**" Knowing who we are gives us dignity. Being called by name presumes intimacy.

In the Hebrew scriptures, knowing and using another's name was to have power over them. This is one of the reasons why God's name is never spoken by Israel. No one has power over God. In the Christian scriptures, however, names are readily and generously used. We are invited to call God by name and Jesus assures and shows us that God knows each of us by name and we are all invited to use the family name. The days of distance are over. In Mark's gospel, especially, the moment when Peter names who Jesus is, the entire story changes. Everything in the gospel so far has been preparing for this moment. Until now only the evil spirits know who Jesus really is and they have been ordered to remain silent.

Now Peter names that Jesus is the anointed one, for whom Israel has longed and hoped. Everything that follows in the gospel is a consequence of this revelation. Peter's confession of faith in and about Jesus is instructive about the God in whom we believe. Jesus does not seem worried about naming rights and religious conventions. His power does not come from his secrecy, but from his generosity of heart, his authoritative teaching, and his intimacy with those around him. People felt known and loved by him. This is the face and name of our God. Not some remote being aloof from our day-to-day struggles, but one who is with us at every step of our life. Old habits die hard, however, and Peter wants his Messiah to be powerful and strong in standing up to the authorities in Jerusalem. Jesus knows that the real love and intimacy of God is not found in acts of might and domination, but in the extraordinary love of the cross. And all of us who are called by his name are challenged to do likewise and lose ourselves in being generous of heart, authoritative in the stand we take on matters of conscience and truth, and intimate with those around us.

The soldiers at Gallipoli in World War 1, were slaughtered, but they died knowing who they were. May we never have to suffer the same agony or folly as they did. But may the way we live out the suffering and pain of our own life demonstrate the dignity of knowing that there is meaning and hope even in our darkest hours and that God is with us even through the valley of death.
