FR STEPHEN WRITES: THE FUTURE (Part 3/3) This Wednesday, we look forward to celebrating Our Lady's Birthday **and** the 40th anniversary of the first opening of our current church building. **Please come! But as we have only 65 seats, please book!** Any birth is of course a pointer to the future, any new church building is likewise an investment in and a hope for the future too. As we consider Our Lady's earthly life, we see times of joy and sorrow, anxiety and hope set against her trusting faith in God. Any parish will have seen the same too, all, please God, set against faith and trust. And currently, as we discover what any lasting effects of the pandemic might be, we cannot be sure of when 'normality' will arrive and what it will be. Certainly, if we do not have more parishioners able to return to Mass, we shall be operating as a parish half the size it was two years ago, and that would obviously mean changes, a new normality. (We are not full at 1045: please book just in case we *do* become full, and you might have to stand outside). Almost all parishes are in the same position. **Thank you** to all of you who continue to support the parish whether that is in person or by sharing Mass over the internet. Thank you for your giving which pays our bills. Thank you for volunteers not only cleaning and stewarding but now providing tea and coffee each week, and others giving their time to keep the parish very much alive.

We have as our patron a simple and humble man who achieved great things through the very ordinary: family life, work, prayer, and in caring for his wife and her Son (as Fr Peter helps us reflect on this week). May the prayers of St Joseph help us be faithful in the ordinary that we may allow God's grace to fulfil in us the extraordinary promises He makes to all who would follow Him. God bless you.

FR PETER REFLECTS: The first area the Archbishop highlights for the diocesan vision is Evangelisation. As we celebrate 40 years of our parish's mission to the local community and beyond, St John Paul II inspires us: "At the workbench where he plied his trade together with Jesus, Joseph brought human work closer to the mystery of the Redemption. In the human growth of Jesus "in wisdom, age and grace", the virtue of industriousness played a notable role, since "work is a human good" which "transforms nature" and makes man "in a sense more human"... St Joseph is the model of those humble ones that Christianity raises up to great destinies...he is the proof that in order to be a good and genuine follower of Christ, there is no need of great things – it is enough to have the common, simple and human virtues, but they need to be true and authentic." (*Redemptoris Custos*, 23-24).

RESTORING THE SUNDAY OBLIGATION The Bishops of England and Wales are considering bringing back the obligation to be at Sunday Mass on Advent Sunday. They are keen that we do not lose sight of the gift of
