THE WORD OF THE LORD

The theme of today's readings: Do you have faith in God?

First reading Job 38:1,8-11 In a series of dialogues, Job and his friends discussed the mystery of human suffering. However, they could not find an adequate answer to the question: "Why must a just man suffer?" as Job has suffered. God answers their question by speaking out of the storm and asking Job: "Who rules the sea?" which is another way of asking, "Job, do you not have faith in me, the God of Creation?" God has the power to do things that human beings can not fully understand or explain. God was telling Job that he needed to remember this and have faith. The experience of the just man Job in his suffering and God's creative power in commanding the sea foreshadows the same themes in the Gospels. Jesus not only shows the same power over the sea in two miracles, but he is the one genuinely righteous/just and sinless man who suffers for the sins of humanity. Jesus suffers in his passion and offers his life in a sacrifice that is the will of God in his plan to bring about humanity's redemption from sin and death.

Psalm 107 prepares us for today's gospel, Jesus calming the violent storm. It is also a metaphor for life. Sometimes, life overwhelms us, and we fear we can not survive. Our faith is put to the test, just as Job's faith was tested. In those times, we must call upon the Lord and put our faith and hope in him, knowing that he has the power to save us.

Second reading 2Corinthians 5:14-17 Jesus died so that we might truly live in a risen life that defies the power of physical death. Jesus' death produced a new order in a new creation.

Gospel Mark 4:35-41 When Jesus calmed the storm, he asked his disciples, "Do you not yet have faith?" What Jesus asked the disciples would become the lingering question from this event until after the Resurrection when Thomas confesses, "My Lord and my God!" Do we have faith in Jesus, our Lord and our God?

GENERAL ELECTION There are some summaries of the **Principles of Catholic Social Teaching** at the back of church, intended to help inform how we vote at the General Election on 4th July. Please feel free to take one. The Church does not, of course, dictate to Catholics how they should vote, but our faith does provide guiding principles for making decisions. We should vote according to a well-informed conscience, that is, a conscience formed under the guidance of the Holy Spirit through prayer, studying Scripture, and honestly informing oneself about the moral teachings of the Catholic Church.

NEW VOTIVE CANDLE STANDS You may have noticed



some new votive candle stands in church. We are trialling a smokeless and generally cleaner system of burning votive candles, which we hope to adopt. Candles are stored on the shelf at the bottom of the stands. Please carefully place a candle (suggested offering 30p) into a fixed glass holder (red for the Saints and the Sacred Heart; blue for Our Lady) and light it using the lighter that is in the holder on the side of the stand (no more wax spillages!)

Please do not place any other kind of votive candle on top of the holders.

The glass system eliminates the need for any plastic/metal cups, with an obvious environmental benefit.

The outer (red or blue) glass is secured on the stand.

The candle itself sits in the inner glass.

Once it comes to the end of its life it falls through a hole at the bottom of the glass, extinguishing itself on the way down, falling into a water bath to guarantee quenching. Any wax gathered in the water bath is collected and recycled.

The candle is made from 3 times refined paraffin and therefore emits very little soot or smoke, protecting the church's features and artifacts from damage.
