#### ARTICLE 1 – UNDERSTANDING CATHOLIC SCHOOLS – THE HISTORICAL CONTEXT

Today most members of the Catholic Church take the existence of its schools (almost) for granted. However, the creation and continued existence of a state supported 'Catholic sector' is the result of two key decisions of the bishops taken some ninety years apart; the first in 1850, the second in 1944.

Both decisions reflected their concern to provide an effective mechanism for the transmission of Catholic faith and culture for the Catholic community, and to secure control over the style and content of religious instruction. Catholic schools were where people learned their Catholicism becoming, with the home and church, a tripartite self-sustaining community structure.

Their provision has involved the Catholic community in considerable capital expense over the years, and the acceptance of an on-going financial responsibility for their maintenance and improvement. In so doing, the Church has become a net contributor to the overall cost of providing the national education system.

Catholic schools seek to provide an education that is appropriate to any civic institution, but taught within a religious context, that permeates all aspects of their day-to-day activities. They are expected to provide high educational standards and exercise a particular duty to care for the poor and disadvantaged – a central element of the bishops' educative mission for over 170 years. That objective was initially expressed in the decision to build elementary schools before churches. Today, it is reflected in a rejection of pupil selection by ability or aptitude.

The Catholic Church being a charity by nature, aims at providing education to every person and to every child irrespective of their social background. It is the intention of every Catholic, to promote equality by providing good education so that students can have access to opportunities provided by society. It is important that members of the Catholic Church, being providers of education opportunities to the society, should themselves take advantage of the good education they provide, to make sure that their children have it too.

The aims of Catholic education is to help the children and students to develop the ability to listen; to think critically, spiritually, ethically and theologically. The Church wants all people to acquire knowledge, to organise it effectively and to make informed judgements in the light of the Christian teaching. Catholic schools are therefore stations where Faith, Hope and Love of God are passed on to learners.

**Father's Day, Day for Life, Refugee Week** As we celebrate Father's Day this Sunday, we pray for all those who have chosen the vocation of the father of a family or those who exercise a fatherly role in the care of others. May their desire to fulfil their calling well be sustained by keeping always before them the all-merciful Heavenly Father, and images such as the Father of the Prodigal Son.

The Day for Life is also this Sunday. It is an annual day to reflect something of the dignity of human life at every stage.
