WHO ARE CATHOLIC SCHOOLS PROVIDED FOR?

Catholic schools are an arm of the Church and its religious mission, placing Jesus Christ and his teaching at the centre of people's lives. The Church provides them to assist Catholic parents, arguing that, as it is parents who have given life to their children, they must always retain prime responsibility for their education and religious formation. This pledge is given at the baptism of the child when parents and God parents make promise before the minister and the Church that they would bring up the child within the atmosphere of Catholic education

Catholic schools are more than just institutions for equipping pupils with knowledge and skills necessary for the workplace and responsible citizenship. They go further to be intended as communities that inform the Christian basis of values, motivation, aspirations and the moral imperatives underlying individual choices and actions. In doing so, they serve the local Church community providing a partnership between the home and the parish. The Church looks at its Catholic institutions of learning, as bases where, from the very start of the child's life, knowledge of God and faith in Jesus Christ can be learned and lived in practice.

Although Catholic schools in England were established first and foremost to ensure the right of Catholic parents to choose a Catholic education for their child, they also provide a general service by contributing to the common good of society and its culture. Children learn how to live by Gospel values and take a considered approach to their lives. They benefit the public by helping develop highly educated, skilled and cultured individuals, who recognise and understand their civic obligations.

While the existence of Catholic Schools guarantees freedom and right of Catholic and none catholic families to see that their children receive the sort of education they wish for them, it is important that those who use them, support them to achieve their purpose. And where there are 'spare' places in Catholic schools they should be made available to any non-Catholic parents who also value the high quality education they provide.
