New Parish Hall Project Update!

The Planning permission was granted by the Council on 23rd April. The tender was submitted to four contractors on 22nd April. All contractors prior to the issue of the tender confirmed that they were interested in taking part in the exercise. The return date of 20th May 2024 was agreed. During the process we received the usual tender gueries, and one contractor undertook a site visit. On the return date we received one tender from Integra Buildings at £785K. The other three tenders later confirmed that they were not submitting a tender all siting that they could not achieve a budget of below £500K. However, last week. The Paragon Spaces another tender submitted their quote at £679K. Nevertheless, our hope is that we shall be able to bring the figure down to around £600K, which we believe is achievable without any significant effect to the size and specification" of the design of a new hall. Having come this far, we are very keen to see this project through to completion. On the basis that the building can be delivered for a total cost of £600k. we have managed to secure these grants: Bernard Sunley Foundation £50k (Secured), Joseph Rank Trust £50k (secured). Poor Mission Fund £100k (request archdiocese for additional £50K). Albert Gubay Foundation £300k (Request Gubay for another £50K). Shortfall of £100K. Will keep you updated.

We have been asked to continue with our parish fundraising effort. I hope you will generously support our Summer Car Boot Sale and Fun Faire event coming up on Sunday July 21st

13th Sunday Year B

Readings: Acts 12:1-11; Ps. 33; 2 Tim. 4:6-8,17-18; Mt 16:13-19

Faith and Mission - Solemnity of SS Peter & Paul.

These are the principal pillars of the Catholic Church founded by Christ. Peter was chosen by Christ to be his first vicar on earth endowed with the keys of the kingdom of heaven and charged with the role of the shepherd of Christ's flock. In St Peter and his successors, we can see a visible sign of unity and communion in faith and charity. divine grace led St Peter to profess Christ's divinity. He suffered martyrdom under Nero in 66 or 67 A.D. He was buried at the hill of the Vatican where recent excavations have revealed what could well be his tomb on the very site of St Peter's Basilica. St Peter represent the faith of the Church and through St Peter Christ has revealed how essential is faith for the Church to survive and flourish. Jesus was with Peter for three years, early in his public life, he could have made St Peter the head of the Church, but he did not. Why? Jesus knew that Peter was weak, so weak that at one time he was overthrown by the words of a single maidservant. Therefore, Jesus waited for the weak man to grow stronger and stronger and his faith in him to become unassailable. When Jesus asked, "who do you say that I am?" and when Peter answered. "You are the son of the living God", Jesus knew that Peter's faith had grown rock like, and gave him the keys of the kingdom. The faith of St Peter grew stronger still when the Holy Spirit came upon the apostles. His faith in Christ later became a beacon light to all other followers, so much so when a cripple at the temple gate begged him for some alms, St Peter, could say only this, "I have neither silver nor gold, but I will give you what I have: in the name of Jesus, walk" (Acts 3:6).

St Paul was chosen by Christ himself on the road to Damascus to form part of the apostolic college. He was an instrument selected to bring Christ's name to all people, he is the greatest missionary of all time, the advocate and apostle of the pagans. St Paul represents the mission of the Church and through him Christ has revealed how important it's for the Church to continue his mission. What is it that gave St Paul the strength and courage to "pour away his life, as a libation" in the service of the Good News? What is it that gave him the zeal and fire "to fight the good fight to the end and to run the race to the finish" (2Tim 4:6-8)? It was not for any earthly reward nor for any personal profit that he spent every breath of his life; the real reason was his conviction that the Good News he preached is not a human message but something that he learnt only through a revelation of Jesus Christ. The real reason was his belief that God had created him in his mother's womb to preach the gospel. Conferred - (Gal 1:15-16).

This gospel in which Christ gives to St Peter: the keys of the kingdom, and the power - to bind and loose on earth (Mt 16:19), helps us to understand the authority Jesus gave to Peter. This passage might be taken as clear evidence to a catholic believer that Christ gave his authority to St Peter and to his successors. If so, today's feast could be seen as a celebration of the authority of the pope. But the church resists this temptation. She rather wants to balance the authority in the Church with her faith and mission. That is why she prefers to celebrate, not just the feast of the authority of St Peter, who also stands for the faith of the Church but, together with him, that St Paul who stands for the challenge of mission entrusted by Christ to his Church.

Thus, the feast is a reminder to all of us that the authority of the Church will be ineffective if there is no faith in her; because only those who believe are obedient and only those who are obedient believe. Faith is not idle; it works while it waits.
