SIN AND THE HUMAN CONDITION.

The journey of life for Christians calls for a daily examination of the conscience regarding our thoughts, deeds and the responses we have given in different situations. Socrates, one of the ancient philosophers said, 'The unexamined life is not worth living.' On a similar note, the book of Proverbs says, 'Every prudent man acts with reflection' (Prov13:16). Our self-knowledge can be enhanced if we give a true reflection of ourselves and act according to Divine law, as explained by our Lord Jesus. Today the modern world contains liberal-minded people with opinions on issues of faith and sin, which can affect Christian life. Sin is a human condition that needs to be addressed by the application of the Gospel values. The Church teaches that, 'Sin is before all else an offence against God, a rupture of communion with him. At the same time, it damages communion with the Church' (CCC140). Sin, therefore, exposes our weakness and our lack of trust in God's love and brings shame and suffering upon us. After committing the sin of disobedience, the first human being was afraid to meet the Lord. He explained 'I was afraid because I was naked, so I hid. "Who told you that you were naked?" he asked'. (Gen3:9-11). It is possible to avoid becoming accustomed to sin if we carry out a sincere, daily examination of conscience based on the Divine Law of love. We need to be guided by the will of God, without which we can experience moral delusion and a spiritual darkness.

As we celebrate the 10th Sunday, the readings invite us to reflect on the human condition of sin and God's loving mercy. The first reading, from the book of Genesis, gives the origin of sin as being from the first parents of humanity. It was the sin of disobedience and pride. These aspects of sin still run through human nature even today. We sometimes try to act independently and ignore the Lord's law in our lives, and at the end many things go wrong with our undertakings. Despite our sinfulness, the Lord follows us so that we can return to him. Today's gospel also explains the sin of pride committed through rejecting the Divine power of Jesus. The Scribes said, 'Beelzebul is in him," and, "It is through the prince of devils that he casts devils out," Then the Lord, answered them "How can Satan cast out Satan." It is true that in many cases our pride

obscures the truth. We are called to be guided by the truth of the Gospel of Christ and not led by ideologies that have been developed through human pride. We need to express our faith and commitment to the truth and learn how to live our life through authentic, Christian teaching. We should avoid being led by seeking an easy way of life. The gospel values should transform us from within and we must not modify Christ's teachings to suit our social milieu in the modern world.
