

## THE WORD OF THE LORD

# The theme of today's readings:

**First reading** Amos 7:12-15 Men and women in every generation since Jesus's earthly mission have the choice of accepting or rejecting his Gospel message of salvation and the gift of the Church, the vehicle Jesus established to lead humanity on the pathway to eternal salvation. People have had a choice to make throughout salvation history: to embrace and accept a way of life in obedience to the commands and prohibitions for those in covenant with God or to determine for oneself what is right or wrong and reject God's path to salvation. Our first reading recounts how Amos the prophet and his message were rejected.

Psalm 85 declares that God has been good to his people in the past, and has good plans for his people in the future.

**Second reading** *Ephesians 1:3-14* St. Paul's message reminds us that all Christians should be grateful for their divine election through Christ Jesus as sons and daughters in the family of God. We show our gratitude by striving to accept and be obedient to the Gospel message and teachings of Jesus and God's holy words governing our conduct in Sacred Scripture. Those teachings must not be altered or watered down to suit the agenda of secular culture.

**Gospel** Mark 6:7-13 Jesus sends out the Apostles on their first mission to heal the sick, drive out demons, and call the people to mend their relationship with God through the repentance of their sins. That mission continues today through their successors. Now, as then, some people will hear and accept Jesus's message of salvation, and others will reject or pollute the message by their false understanding.

ST VINCENT DE PAUL SOCIETY: "turning concern into action" As part of the parish centenary year, it is hoped to reestablish the St Vincent de Paul group here at All Souls (SVP for short). Initial meetings have taken place and now, to get up and running, more members are needed. The group typically meets once a fortnight at the parish office, where we identify those people in need, and discuss how we can help them - by arranging regular visits and offering practical or financial help if needed. Our meetings start with prayers and a reflection, that indicates the spiritual core of our mission, inspired by our patron saint St Vincent de Paul. On occasion we will ask the parish to help support our work with church collections and requests for any furniture or household items that are needed. We also plan to do run seasonal projects like making Christmas hampers for those who appreciate a little help at that time of the year. Guidance and training are provided, and members always work together to support each other in achieving the society's simple aim of 'turning concern into action'. The next meeting will take place on Wednesday 17th July, at **6.30pm** in the parish office. Everyone is very welcome to come along and find out more about the St Vincent de Paul Society.
