# THE WORD OF THE LORD

# The theme of today's readings: The hand of the Lord feeds us

Sharing a meal is a form of fellowship and an expression of family unity. This significance of sharing a meal applies to meals with friends and family and to sharing the Church's 'family meal' of fellowship with God the Father in the Eucharist. The sacred fellowship meal of the Eucharist is both a present and future reality. The Eucharist is a sharing of the life of Christ in the present in our earthly sanctuaries (churches), but it also points to the banquet of the redeemed at the end of time in the heavenly sanctuary. For the next five Sundays our readings will focus on miracle feedings and teachings that prefigure the Eucharist.

#### First reading 2Kings 4:42-44

The feeding miracle of the prophet Elisha prefigures the miraculous feedings in the Gospels. Jesus will repeat Elisha's miracle feeding of the multiplication of barley loaves in our Gospel Reading. Both feeding miracles recall the miraculous manna which God fed the children of Israel while travelling through the wilderness on their journey to the Promised Land (Exodus 16:31-36).

**Psalm 145** invites the congregation to praise God, whose mighty works are evidence of his divine Kingship. In God's hesed, a Hebrew word meaning "covenant love," he provides for our needs and the needs of all living things throughout the year's seasons. Thus, we receive assurance that, even when we can not understand God's unfolding plan, we can have confidence that all his ways and works are holy, and he is near to all who call on him in purity, humility, and truth of heart.

#### Second reading Ephesians 4:1-6

St. Paul exhorts the faithful Christians of Ephesus to persevere in the unity of faith within their congregation. St. Paul expresses one of the most profound statements summarising our Christian faith in the New Testament. His message focuses on the theological basis of our unity - the Most Holy Trinity. The Divine Presence of the Most Holy Trinity is at work in the Church and keeps the New Covenant family together in "seven unities": one Body, one Spirit, one hope, one Lord, one faith, one baptism, and one God and Father.

# Gospel John 6:1-15

Like the prophet Elisha centuries earlier, Jesus does not have enough bread to feed a multitude. However, he organises and presides over the meal, as he does in the Eucharist when we break bread together as a family. Like the miracle feeding of the manna in the wilderness, Jesus is the new Moses who provides what the faithful children of the covenant need. In the sacred meal of the Eucharist, it is as the psalm puts is: "You open wide your hand, O Lord, and grant all our desires."
